Pentecost Sunday Year A
31st May 2020
"Empowering of the Disciples"



Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost. Pentecost comes from the word *pente*, the Greek word for fifty. So, Pentecost is fifty days after Jesus was resurrected from the dead during Easter. Today's Gospel passage gives a vivid account of how the Risen Lord appeared to the disciples who were frightened and disheartened by the death of Jesus. He gave them joy and peace as gifts and strengthened their weak faith by appearing to them in His risen and glorified form. He further gave them His mission and sent them. His mission is the mission of the Father.

Then the Risen Lord breathed on them and gave them the Holy Spirit who empowered them. Then He gave them authority and power to proclaim the word of God. With the Holy Spirit, the power from above was given to them so that they are able to witness to the Risen Lord boldly. The Feast of Pentecost invites us to become aware of the presence of the Holy Spirit and the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our lives and live a life filled with the fruits of the Holy Spirit: joy, peace and forgiveness and a sense of divine mission.

We live our entire Christian lives in the Spirit. He is everpresent to us, constantly prompts us and impels us forwards in our life of faith. The Holy Spirit moreover draws us together in unity as a parish we witness to what Christ has achieved but we do so as one body united in faith and worship. The Holy Spirit also keeps his Church holy, we are constantly cleansed and forgiven through the celebration of the sacraments.

Message from Bishop Anthony

The Archdiocese of Sydney has developed a site to assist parishes throughout Australia as they respond to the easing of restrictions and the introduction of public Masses again. It is called massregister.com.au.

Bishop Anthony has recommended its use throughout our own Diocese of Broken Bay – though it is for individual parishes to consider its merit and to decide on its implementation.

Mass register.com.au is a site on which we can ask those people who are nominating to attend our parish Masses or who are intending to visit our church to log-in their details. Please note that the site does not allow people to nominate for a particular Mass on a particular day. This would have to be done through other local means, such as through the parish office. However, it is most convenient way by which parishes can be assisted to keep a log of all those who are attending their site.

Dear brothers,

Subsequent to Bishop Anthony's welcome letter to us earlier today in respect to how we can respond to the easing of restrictions occasioned by the pandemic, and in response to some questions you have raised, might I add the following clarifications in regards to the numbers able to be present at any one religious gathering?

For Masses generally: the number is 10 plus the priest. The number 10 includes people such as servers, readers, musicians. It is important that we do not flaunt the regulation of only 10 people inside the church, such that it doubles in number because of all those regarded as 'assistants.'

For Weddings: the number is 10 plus the priest and the bride and groom.

For Funerals: the number is for indoors, 20 plus the priest and the funeral director attendants; for outdoors, 30 plus the priest and the funeral director attendants.

For Baptisms: the number is 10, including family and guests, plus the priest.


