

Synod of Bishops 2021-2023 Members of the XVI General Ordinary assembly will be gathering in Rome in just a few days' time, along with our Broken Bay representatives, Bishop Anthony Randazzo, and Diocesan Chancellor, Mrs Kelly Paget.
