THE LORD IS RISEN! ALLELUIA



In the first reading Peter and other Apostles give a powerful and convincing testimony regarding the life of Jesus: His death on the cross and His resurrection from the dead. The Apostles had the unique privilege of meeting the Risen Lord personally- sharing meals with Him and experiencing His life-giving presence. He assures them that everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins. Finding the empty tomb points to the resurrection of Jesus.

Today's Gospel gives a detailed description of the happenings on Easter Sunday morning is given. The first visitor to the tomb of Jesus was Mary Magdalene. She found that the tomb of Jesus was empty, and she thought that the body of Jesus was taken away by someone. She hurriedly went and reported the matter to the disciples. Peter and John, two of the Apostles went to the tomb and found it to be empty. The truth of what the scriptures had foretold began to dawn upon them that Jesus would rise from the dead.

The empty tomb is a proof of the resurrection of Jesus and an indication that Jesus is not to be found among the dead. Later the disciples had several personal appearances of the risen Lord on various occasions and their faith was strengthened by those comforting and life-giving experiences. They finally realized that Jesus is truly risen from the dead. In our case too although we have the testimony of the Apostles and other disciples that Jesus is risen, we need to be strengthened in our faith by personally experiencing the risen Lord.

MAY THE RISEN LORD BLESS YOU AND STRENGTHEN YOUR FAITH - "The resurrection of Jesus changes the face of death for all His people. Death is no longer a prison but a passage into God's presence. First Reading Acts 10:34, 37-43 A reading from the Acts of the Apostles We have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.' Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name'.

'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
