Gospel Reflection - © Fr Michael Tate



Eighteen years ago my father died: a good man, a very good man, a wonderful husband to my mother and a great father to "the boys". The following Sunday I had to read this gospel: "if anyone comes to me without hating his father ...he cannot be my disciple".

I could hardly speak the words because, to our ears attuned to the English language and way of speaking, it sounds so dreadful, so extreme, so full of ill will.

Fortunately, I got through because I was able to put this passage in context.

First, the way of speaking in the Middle East. In most languages of that region, there is no word for "prefer". If someone prefers X over Y, he will say I love X and hate Y. Why this extreme? It is said to have something to do with the climate. Scorching heat and unrelenting glare during the day, changing quickly to the cold and darkness of the night, led to a vocabulary of

extremes: one thing or the other. Can anyone imagine for one moment Jesus hating either Mary or Joseph. No. Never any ill will towards them, but if it

came to a choice he did prefer following his calling. And sometimes that caused great anguish to both Mary and Joseph.

One only has to think of his staying behind at the temple on his twelfth birthday rather than returning with the group of pilgrims to Galilee. Mary and Joseph were filled with aching concern, rushed back to Jerusalem, and Mary says: "My child, why have you done this to us? See how worried your father and I have been, looking for you." Jesus replied "Why were you looking for me? Do you now know that I must be busy about my Father's business?"

This is the sort of preference which Jesus is speaking of. It may well cause confusion and heartache in families. [I rather hope Joseph expressed that by giving Jesus a clip under the ear and setting him firmly on the road back to Nazareth!]

Secondly, I recognised that Jesus was speaking in the context of imminent persecution of Himself and just as certainly of his followers.

He brought them face to face with the reality of what it meant to follow him. The symbol of torture and execution – the Cross – loomed into view. But, before that, he predicted the real-life situation of families turning against a follower of Jesus, of denouncing a son or daughter, of turning them in to the authorities.

Where does this passage find relevance today?

In China, many good things are happening as hundreds of millions of people are lifted out of dire poverty. But the fact remains that China is ruled by an authoritarian regime with an ideology of total control of the allegiance of the Chinese people. The underground Catholic Church, despite recent overtures by Pope Benedict XVI, is still persecuted.

Can you imagine a Chinese Catholic disciple of Our Lord hearing this Gospel this morning, and this afternoon having to definitively choose between Him and the Church He founded on Peter, or doing what the family considers safe and reasonable.

According to today's Gospel, followers of Jesus Christ must prefer to do this, must prefer the ostracism and cutting off from family, must prefer this cross. But they must never hate in the English sense of that word.

During this Mass let us particularly remember those for whom preferring Jesus over families exacts real penalties of property, of education and advancement, of liberty, and even of life.

May members of families torn apart because of the following of Jesus one day be re-united in the one family of humanity reconciled by Jesus Christ, in Jesus Christ, in Heavenly glory.
