

Toward the end of 1999 people were gearing up to welcome in the new millennium. Some Christians who take the scriptures literally joined in the fun and declared that the end of the world was nigh and that Christ would return on his two-thousandth birthday.

They seem to subscribe to the old adage that, 'one should never let the facts get in the way of a good story'!

Christianity took over the Roman calendar in what we now call the 4th Century of the Christian era. At Rome in 526, a scholarly monk named Dionysius Exiguus compiled a list of the dates of Jesus' birth, death and resurrection. He assigned dates in the new

Christian calendar for each of these events. Given the tools at his disposal, he did an extraordinary job. We know, however, from other historical sources and from the New Testament, where it mentions who the various Jewish and Roman rulers were in Palestine, that Dionysius was four years out with his dating. The church became aware of this mistake in 1582, but to correct it the world would have lost four years! So we have all lived with it ever since.

We can, however, safely assume that Jesus knows the year in which he was born and that if our fundamentalist Christian friends are right in believing he was going to return on his 2000th birthday, he would have done so in 1996!

The facts are that in every generation we have had people tell us that the sun, moon, stars, wars, famine, tidal waves and earthquakes, mentioned in today's Gospel, all demonstrate that Jesus is about to return. Clearly, we are still waiting. If only the Christians who give out these dire predictions, every so often, would take as seriously Jesus' words, 'You will know not the time, nor the place when the Son of Man will return in glory'. Luke's community thought that Jesus would return quickly and spectacularly. They were surprised that the first generation of Christian believers was dying without seeing it all happen. Given the terrible suffering they were enduring for Jesus, the early Christians no doubt hoped that the end of the world would be soon and would demonstrate to everyone that they were not foolish to cling to Christ in the face of all opposition and persecution. The early Christians knew that there was no point professing faith in Jesus Christ unless our daily behaviour reflects his kingdom. It has been a telling point ever since. If every Christian lived out the Gospel in his or her daily life, the world would be transformed and Christ would come in spectacular fashion.

I haven't got a clue when the world will cease to exist, but on this, the first day of the Church's Year, I know that the Lord returns to us every time we love, forgive, share, are compassionate, are generous and sacrificial toward one another. It may not be as grand as dancing suns and tidal waves, but the heroic love of a parent for a child, a spouse for their sick partner and the first world sharing with the third world are spectacular enough for me to believe that Jesus' kingdom comes every day, in every hour, at every moment.

May this first Eucharist of the Church's year be a taste for us of the Kingdom of God that is both present amongst us and still to come. And may the Advent season sustain us in our waiting and give us courage in our living.

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Plenary Herald on Fellowship

Communion, or as, the word is translated in the New Testament, fellowship has been a deeply embedded characteristic of Christian communities since the resurrection of Jesus the Christ. It is apparent from the account of the apostolic community that took shape in Jerusalem there was among them a great sense of love and commitment to each other (Acts 2:42-47; 4:32-37). As Paul, furthermore, founded more and communities among the Gentiles his letters spoke boldly about the importance of fellowship.

We are the successors of this tradition. Now, however, the theology and spirituality of community has matured to include our lives in the Trinity. We now acknowledge that our fellowship, our communion, is a participation in the divine fellowship of the Trinity. The three persons of the Trinity are interdependent. They share in one life. They are one God. The Christian community today is a fellowship modelled on the Trinity. Several persons, one community. Each person nourishes and sustains the being of the others.

Our Christian communities today do not have the same intensity about their lives as the early communities of the church but Francis wants some of the zeal and the care for the material welfare of each other to be reignited in our fellowship.

Dialogue sessions, in which people share their stories of their experience and understanding of life in God, their spirituality of communion, are one powerful means by which fellowship can grow and become a meaningful part of our lives
