Do you consider yourself to be a Traditional Catholic? It is likely that most people would say Yes to such a question but each person would have her or his own interpretation of the word *Traditional*.

Some people consider the church's Tradition to be unchanging and others consider the Tradition to be a body of teachings that are continually growing such that they make sense in a contemporary world. The growing tradition is described as a living tradition. The Second Vatican Council introduced this term to the People of God in its constitution on divine revelation (<u>Dei verbum</u>. 8).

The living tradition is the continuing updating of the teachings of the church to ensure that the teachings make sense in different cultures and different times. Vatican II also made clear that the living tradition grows through the participation of all the People of God.

How does this living tradition grow in practice? The Catholic tradition grows through a process of listening and dialogue amongst all the People of God. The process begins at the grassroots, the non-ordained people, the laity, listening and talking to each other about what God expects of Catholics in Australia in the contemporary world. This is where the real work of the Holy Spirit: where two or three are gathered in the name of Jesus.

In our parish, three opportunities will be provided during Advent for people to gather and share what the Holy Spirit is saying to them.
