Pastoral Discernment Central Coast

The Bishop has given some more details about the next steps in this process:

An Implementation Task Group is to be established to consider the Report and to make recommendations for the Bishop's consideration with respect to the implementation of the findings. Members of the Task Group, and Terms of Reference will be communicated in February 2023.

As soon as practical a Pastoral Discernment Facilitator will be appointed to undertake the role of Executive Officer (EO) to the Task Group. This person will assist the Task Group in the formulation and implementation of the recommendations and prepare for the future Northern Beaches Deanery Discernment.

He has asked for prayers for the continued success of this important initiative as we journey forward together for the people of God in the region of the Central Coast and the wider Diocesan community.

The Memorare

On this special Feast of Mary the Mother of God you may choose to say this ancient prayer.

The Memorare is a Catholic prayer seeking the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It first appears as part of a longer 15th-century prayer.

The Memorare

Remember, O most loving Virgin Mary, that never was it known that any one who fled to thy protection, implored thy help or sought thy intercession, was left unaided.

Inspired with this confidence,
I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins,
my Mother; to thee do I come, before thee
I stand, sinful and sorrowful.
O Mother of thy Word Incarnate,
despise not my petitions,
but in thy clemency hear and answer me.
Amen.



Many saints found comfort and miracles through the intercession of this loved prayer, including St Bernard and St Francis de Sales and also St Teresa of Calcutta.

St Teresa of Calcutta's "Flying Novena"

When needing an answer to prayers quickly and without delay, Mother Teresa of Calcutta famously prayed a "Flying Novena". This is a simple and quick way to pray a 'novena' when you don't have the full nine days.

Mother Teresa would pray the Memorare prayer nine times in a row rather than praying it once a day for 9 days. She was so confident in God's providence and the Virgin Mary's intercession that she would also say a 10th Memorare in thanksgiving immediately afterwards. Her religious sisters, the Missionaries of Charity, continue this practice today.

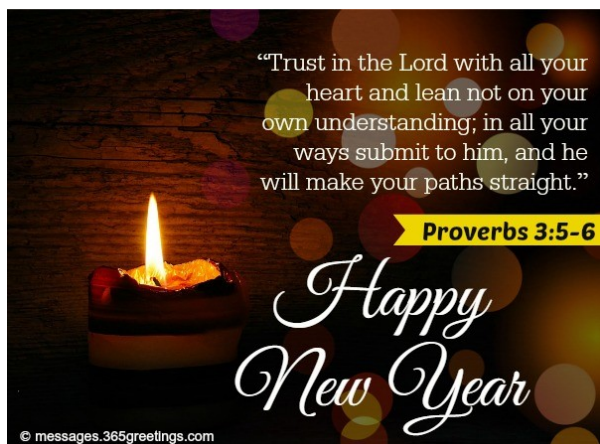
The "Flying Novena" repeated 9 times (or 10 times including the thanksgiving):

Book Club

For our next book club meeting we will be discussing Bishop Barron's book, *Arguing Religion*. This little book has come at a most opportune time, given the current emphasis on evangelisation.

Bishop Barron explains that his intended audience is not a religious believer but rather the sceptic who is a seeker. He adopts a rather intellectual tone because he is convinced that "dumbed-down religion, practised across the denominational divides for about the past 50 years has been a disaster. When the new atheist critiques arose 15 years ago," he explains, "most believers in God didn't have a clue how to respond to what were basically, tired arguments and crude caricatures." His little book, which takes no time to read, is designed to provide a brief smart presentation of faith, with a little handholding. As he explains, "few know how to have a good religious argument— a rational, respectful, and productive exchange of differing views." Join us if this might interest you.

Bookclub meets on the last Friday of each month at 16:00 hours in the parish offices. The book for February is Elizabeth Lev's book titled: *How Catholic Art Saved the Faith: The Triumph of Beauty and Truth in Counter-Reformation Art*. A wonderful visual walk through the sacraments, as explained by some of the greatest artists of the past.

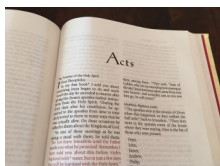


St Vincent de Paul Christmas Appeal Thank you

Objectives:

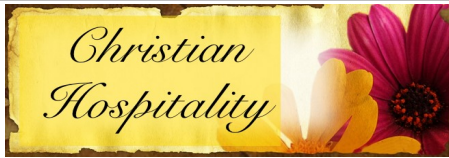
