If you are **unwell**, please take care and **stay at home**.

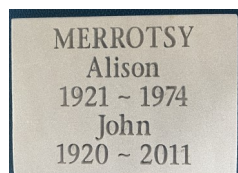

Spiritual direction is really not about being directed, nor is it therapy, or counselling. Rather, it is very much about being encouraged to draw closer to God whether that be in your prayer life, relationships, in nature, or in the events of your life. The privilege and responsibility of a spiritual director is to journey with you, in one on one conversations, as you deepen your relationship with God. What is shared is held in confidence.

A meeting time is agreed upon, usually once a month, for an hour.

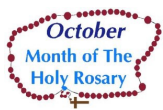


The Feast of St Francis of Assisi

That means a day to day priority, and ongoing commitment.

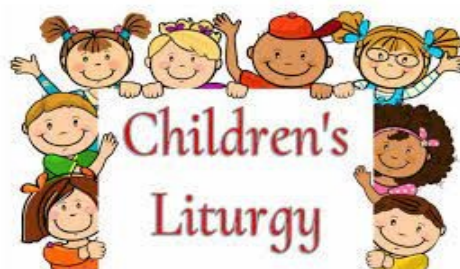
However one month every year we actively do all we can to promote raising awareness around safeguarding. That month is September.

## SAFEGUARDING MONTH families

Safeguarding Awareness Month continues this week and how community connection supports this.

Family involvement and participation within their local community increases safety for children.

- Community connections give children a sense of belonging and help them develop social and other skills. Community connections might include extended family and friends, neighbours and people in local organisations and fellow Parishioners.

Families can help their children make community connections through family activities;

- Walk or cycle to a local park and let your child play on the equipment. Being out in your neighbourhood gives you and your child the chance to meet new people.
- Get involved in community events and take your child along with you. Mass, working bees at school, community gardens, fetes and festivals give you and your child an opportunity to connect with people who are working together.

- Show your child that connection is a two-way thing. When you work with others and help them, they'll do the same for you. For example, you might collect your neighbours' mail when they're on holiday and then they collect yours when you're away.

Look at photos of family and friends with your child to spark her interest in the relationships that are important to your family. You and your child could even work on a [family story book](#) together.

- Role model social skills with people in your community. This can be as simple as saying 'hello', 'please' and 'thank you'. Your child will watch the way you talk with people and follow your example. And this helps your child learn how to get along with people.

## Vox Populi

On October 4, the Church will observe the feast day of Saint Francis of Assisi, a saint who remains just as important today in the lives of many faithful as he did close to 800 years ago.

His affinity for the Eucharist, care for the poor in society, love for creation, and his deep sense of brotherhood towards all God's children are universal and enduring qualities which all the faithful should seek to embody.

He dispensed with an indulgent life and lived a life of poverty in service of others, preaching the Gospel and spreading the Good News.

He founded the Franciscan Order which continues his work close to a millennium later.

So important is his legacy, even in the contemporary age, Pope Francis chose to honour the humble Italian saint through his papal name. It was the first time a pope had taken the name and Pope Francis said he had chosen it due to his concern for the well-being of the poor.

His second encyclical, *Laudato si'*, was very much inspired by St Francis, who had used the phrase in praise of God for his creation.
