The privilege and responsibility of a spiritual director is to journey with you, in one-on-one conversations, as you deepen your relationship with God. What is shared is held in confidence.

## Bookclub

For May our bookclub will be reading and discussing David Bentley Hart's book "That All Shall be Saved: Heaven, Hell, and Universal Salvation. Hart became a member of the Eastern Orthodox Church when quite young and has very broad academic interests. His book in response to new atheists of recent

years was very popular when it was published in 2009. In the introduction to the book we will be reading,

Hart states that he is not expecting to convince anyone of universal salvation, as the dominant view is so "invincibly established, but he is hoping to encourage reflection. The title is an allusion to the scriptural statement in 1 Timothy 2:4 that God "intends that all human beings shall be saved." In June we will be reading Brant Pitre's book "Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist". In July we will read Shusaku Endo's 1993 novel Deep River about four Japanese tourists on a pilgrimage to the Ganges in India in search of spiritual discoveries. Many may be more familiar with his book "Silence" which has been made into a film by Martin Scorsese.
