God of power and mercy open our hearts in welcome. Remove the things that hinder us from receiving Christ with joy so that we may share his wisdom and become one with him when he comes in glory, for he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Reflection:

The second candle on the Advent wreath represents **Peace**. the "**Bethlehem Candle**," the second Advent candle reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem before Mary gave birth to Jesus. Building on the meaning of the Prophecy Candle, this second candle recalls that after all of the division, destruction, and dispersion of the kingdom in the Old Testament, there might finally be peace on Earth – Jesus is coming, and so is His Kingdom of Peace. As we read in the quote from Pope Francis, this light of peace shone forth from Bethlehem for all the world.

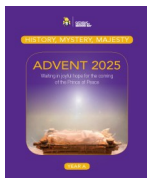
Fr John Puliparambil

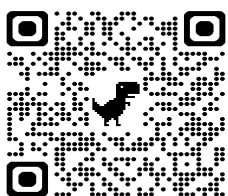

Reconciliation

The **first form** of Reconciliation is available in our parish from **8.30am to 10am** each **Saturday morning**.

A communal celebration of the first form is being celebrated at 7pm at **Kincumber** on Tuesday 16th and **Woy Woy** and **East Gosford** on Friday 19th December.

The **second form** will be celebrated in our parish at **7pm** on **Thursday evening 18th December**. In this ceremony we will have a brief penitential liturgy which will include saying the act of contrition together; then each person will come to the priest and say: "I am sorry for ..." and the priest will pray the prayer of absolution: "I absolve you from your sins ..."; then we will say our penance together.

The priest will be standing near the sanctuary and penitents will line up to confess individually. It is an opportunity to confess but not for a discussion. Unless we have large numbers attending, there will only be one priest.

All are welcome to attend.

The last book club meeting for 2025 as been held and our reading group will be in retreat until the end of January 2026 when we will resume with Greg Sheridan's latest book, **How Christians Can Succeed Today-Reclaiming the Genius of the Early Church**, as usual on the Last Friday of every month in the parish offices at 1600.

It was an interesting year of reading. We started with Richard Rohr's **The Divine Dance** and ended with a divine dance of sorts on the scaffold of revolutionary France with Gertrude von Le Fort's novella. Between those bookends we enjoyed Sheldon Vanauken's wonderful autobiography, **A Severe Mercy**, Corrie ten Boom's autobiography of negotiating her way through occupied Holland, while trying to hide Jewish families in **The Hiding Place**. We read the classics- Julian of Norwich' **Revelations of Divine Love**- and we pondered on what makes a novel catholic when we read Shusaku Endo's **Deep River**. We read David Bentley Hart and survived to tell the tale, and we eavesdropped on a conversation between a Jewish Rabbi, Jacob Neusner and Jesus. We also read Brant Pitre's book on the **Jewish roots of the Eucharist** which helped to add nuance to our understanding of the liturgy. All in all a great year of reading and discussion and fellowship and the sheer joy of reaching for truth, beauty and goodness on the last Friday of every month in the parish offices at 1600. 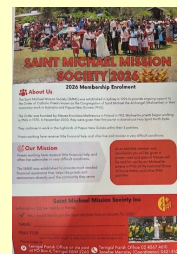
