Dear Jesus, you entered our world on Christmas as the Prince of Peace. This Advent, as we strive to become the-best-version-of-ourselves, fill us with a deep and abiding peace. Help us share that peace with everyone we encounter, especially those who need it most. Amen.

Advent Program

The Coming of Christ

Every Thursday at 7 pm – Parish office.

For 2000 years Jewish people awaited the coming of the promised Messiah. He was to crush Satan and restore the great Kingdom of David.

This week the advent study group examined the biblical prophecies.

We looked at the whole story of the lead up to Advent- why did the Messiah have to come from the house of David? If it's the house of David why is it called the tree of Jesse?

Why did he have to be born in Bethlehem?

What kingdom was he going to restore?

We also looked at the 90 mile journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem along the valleys of the river Jordan taken over five days by a heavily pregnant Mary sitting uncomfortably on a donkey.

We examined the interpretations in scripture of the virgin birth.

The coming of Christ is an extraordinary story. It is the greatest event in history. Our aim is to explore it and understand it.

This week we will be focusing on the spiritual aspects of Christ's birth. What it means to each of us. What it has meant to humankind.

Everyone is invited. No registration is necessary. Bibles are supplied.

Each session lasts for one hour.

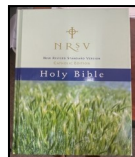

Voluntary Assisted Dying Act 2022

came into effect on 28th November 2023 which means that eligible people in NSW will be able to request medical assistance to end their life.

The Diocese has produced a booklet, an *Interim Pastoral Guideline on Voluntary Assisted Dying*, which includes a full explanation of the Act as well as the Catholic Response. The Australian Catholics Bishop Conference has also produced a document titled *To Witness and to Accompany with Christian Hope* to guide priests, chaplains and pastoral workers who are asked to provide pastoral support to Catholics who are considering euthanasia.

Thank you to all who helped make the Christmas Dinner last Saturday another happy Parish celebration. We had around 80 attend and we had our choir of Angels lead us in Christmas Carols. Thank you to our chefs and helpers.

Safeguarding intimate partner violence amongst young people

The Longitudinal Study of Australian Children commissioned a report of its finding of intimate partner violence between 18–19-year-olds in October 2023. The prevalence of these incidences and the results of the study demonstrate the importance of trust and communication with parents and supportive friendships during adolescences.

The main findings:

1. Around three in 10 adolescents aged 18–19 years reported at least one experience of intimate partner violence in the previous year.
2. Emotional abuse was experienced by one in eight adolescents aged 18–19 years in the previous year.
3. Physical violence was experienced by one in 10 adolescents aged 18–19 years in the previous year.
4. One in 12 adolescents aged 18–19 years experienced sexual abuse in the previous year. Sexual abuse was more prevalent among females aged 18–19 years than males of the same age.

Supportive friendships throughout adolescence reduce the risk of later emotional abuse victimisation by 36%. High trust and good communication with parents during adolescence reduce the risk of later emotional abuse victimisation by 39% and sexual abuse victimisation by 77%.

What is spiritual direction?

In spiritual direction you reflect deeply on the experiences of your daily life, your loves, hurts, dreams, joys and fears.

Gradually, as you contemplate, you may begin to discover how God's spirit is moving in your life and that God has been waiting for you to see this closer relationship.

Spiritual direction is really not about being directed, nor is it therapy, or counselling. Rather, it is very much about being encouraged to draw closer to God whether that be in your prayer life, relationships, in nature, or in the events of your life. The privilege and responsibility of a spiritual director is to journey with you, in one-on-one conversations, as you deepen your relationship with God. What is shared is held in confidence.

A meeting time is agreed upon, usually once a month, for an hour.
