COVID - 19 Requirements— Yes we still need to continue:

434 people permitted into the church for each service.

Sanitize your hands before entry to the church and on your exit from the church.

Sign in each time you come to the church. Use the QR code and the Service NSW app. Greeters will assist you, if you are unsure

Social distancing of 1.5 metres between people from other family groups is required. Please be aware and don't sit directly behind or in front of someone so as to keep a safe distance.

Communion on the hand is preferred. If you want to receive communion on the tongue, please wait until the end of the communion line.

Funerals and weddings in the church can have 217 people. (The limit is 10 people if an unvaccinated person is attending).

In the **celebration of Mass** there can be no congregational singing, although a choir of up to 10 fully vaccinated people can sing. Only those who are fully vaccinated are able to visit the **parish office or hall**. Please register with the QR code when you arrive and wearing masks is recommended.

As **an act of love and a sign of welcome**, let's make our church as safe as possible for everyone. Please stay safe yourself and let's keep each other safe.

If you are unwell or have any symptoms of cold or flu or at high risk of other health conditions, please take care and stay at home.

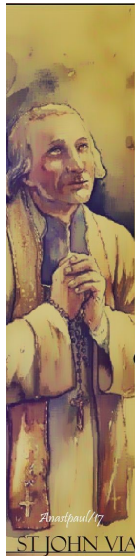

ST JOHN VIANNEY (1786-1859)

The Vatican's Apostolic Penitentiary published a [decree](#) on the 28 October 2021 providing for the possibility of obtaining plenary indulgences in favour of the faithful departed throughout the entire month of November, by devoutly visiting a church or cemetery.

Other requirements include, the faithful must be in the state of grace, receiving the **sacrament of confession** either eight days before or after; receive **Holy Communion** on that day; and recite **prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father** (one Our Father, one Hail Mary is the minimum, but any other

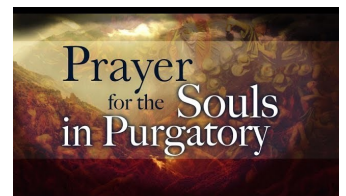
additional prayers may be added).

The Church devotes the month of November to prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory and you will find the **November Mass** envelopes at the back of the church. The names will be written into the November Mass book from these envelopes and the book will then be placed at the foot of the Altar. All the money paid for Masses will be sent to the Michaelite Missions and a Mass for these intentions will be celebrated in November, and beyond.

Every Mass in our church during November will be celebrated for the names entered into our November Mass Book. Place a names a list of names of the people you would like to be prayed for in the bowl at the foot of the alter. Payment is not expected.

An important notice

Euthanasia

The Catholic Church opposes euthanasia – the state sanctioned suicide of the sick – for the same reason that it opposes abortion. God is the author of life and it is God who decides the end of our life. As expressed in the commandment: “thou shalt not kill.” The Catechism of the Church states: “whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists in putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable.” (Clause 2277) The Catechism goes on: “intentional euthanasia... is murder.” (Clause 2324)

There is a positive alternative to euthanasia, palliative care. Here on the Central Coast Gosford hospital provides a high standard of palliative care. A new 40 bed unit was opened only this year.

The New South Wales Parliament is now debating a bill to legalise euthanasia in this state. It carefully avoids using the word “euthanasia” just like the abortion bill avoided using the word “abortion”. It could be voted upon as early as Friday 12 November next.

Our parish covers two state members – the member for The Entrance and the member for Terrigal. The member for The Entrance David Meehan is, disappointingly, one of the sponsors of the bill. The member for Terrigal, Adam Crouch, has so far not made his position known. He has however sent emails to medical practitioners asking for their views.

Members of the congregation of Terrigal Parish who wish the state to uphold Catholic teaching are urged to write to Adam Crouch expressing their opposition to the legislation and supporting palliative care. Letters need not be long. A short letter stating the writer's position is enough. It is important that the letter contains the name and address of the writer. The more letters a Member of Parliament gets the more he understands the views of his constituents.

Plenary Council in Australia / International Synod in Rome.

The Catholic Church changes slowly. It took hundreds of years and two ecumenical councils for it to comprehensively define the nature of Jesus Christ himself as both God and Man. This was partially enunciated in the Nicene Creed which was written in 325 A.D. (ie. 300 years after death of Christ) and only established its final form in 381. A.D.

The Apostles Creed, the other Creed used at Mass, is believed to date from the 5th century, 400 years after the death of Christ.

Reforms introduced by the Second Vatican Council, (1962 – 1965,) are still being implemented. It is no surprise then that the first session of the plenary Council, held by zoom in October 2021, was essentially only a discussion. If there are practical outcomes, along the lines reflected by Terrigal Parish in the parishioners 151 submissions, then these will have to come out of the next session of the Council in July 2022.

Especially confusing for Australians is that the Pope has announced an international Synod for Rome in October 2023. This Synod also seeks to involve the Catholic community and to do so requests a process of consultation which is essentially the same as the process of consultation that was held for the Plenary Council.

This new consultation (17 October to 12 December) overlaps the Plenary Council process. This has been pointed out to the Diocese, but the response so far is that more consultation could lead to a more carefully refined result. More likely it will simply confuse matters.

The Parish Pastoral Council will be called upon to determine its response to the request by the Bishop for a new process of consultation, referred to as "discernment". Many parishioners will wonder why they have to go through what is essentially the same process twice. Especially as there has been no result from the first process.

Both the International Synod and the Plenary Council ask the question of how the church faces the ongoing challenges of the 21st century. These challenges are enormous. The Pope is seeking to meet them through involvement of the entire Catholic community. The Second Vatican Council involved only the bishops. The Pope's aim is to recreate a missionary spirit in the church – a spirit which seeks to evangelise believers as much as non-believers. As he puts it: "new wine in old bottles."
