Communion on the Tongue

For our safety we are still not able to receive Holy Communion from the chalice and receiving Communion on the tongue is tolerated but not encouraged, especially with so many cases of COVID being around us at this time. We are changing the practice for those who choose to receive Holy Communion on the tongue. Until now I and the other ministers have been sanitising our hands after each person who receives Communion on the tongue to protect the next person in the line. But this practice does not allow enough time for the sanitiser to dry and the communion wafer is sticking to the minister's finger and sometimes dropping to the floor. This wafer is then returned to the altar for the priest to consume, even if it has been on the communicant's tongue. This both disrespects the Eucharist and is dangerous for the priest.

So, from today the practice will continue that those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue must come at the end of the communion line, but the minister will not use sanitiser between communicants. This might leave these communicants more vulnerable, but I can see no other way to distribute Holy Communion safely and respectfully.

I am open to discuss other methods of distribution with those who choose not to take Holy Communion in the hand. The use of a purifier, plastic gloves and tongs have already been considered and dismissed.

Mass will be at 5pm followed at 6pm by a three course dinner in the adjoining hall with entertainment.


The parish bus will be going down for anyone who doesn't wish to drive.

As he explains, "few know how to have a good religious argument— a rational, respectful, and productive exchange of differing views."

The book for February is Elizabeth Lev's book titled: How Catholic Art Saved the Faith: The Triumph of Beauty and Truth in Counter-Reformation Art. 


