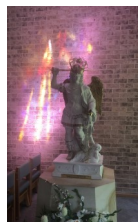

Spiritual direction is really not about being directed, nor is it therapy, or counselling. Rather, it is very much about being encouraged to draw closer to God whether that be in your prayer life, relationships, in nature, or in the events of your life. The privilege and responsibility of a spiritual director is to journey with you, in one on one conversations, as you deepen your relationship with God. What is shared is held in confidence.

A meeting time is agreed upon, usually once a month, for an hour.

BOOKCLUB

C S Lewis who wrote *The Screwtape Letters*, the book we will be discussing at the next bookclub meeting on Friday 27th May at 1600 hrs in the parish offices, was not always Christian. He had lost his belief in his childhood. He wrote about his return to Christianity in his spiritual autobiography *Surprised by Joy* which is a kind of detective's probing of clues and motives that led to his return. When he picked up a collection of essays by Chesterton he wrote "I did not know what I was letting myself in for. A young man who wishes to remain a sound atheist cannot be too careful of his reading. There are traps everywhere." His final acceptance of Jesus Christ occurred while riding in the sidecar of his brother's motorcycle on the way to a zoo. "It was more like when a man, after long sleep, still lying motionless in bed, becomes aware that he is now awake". Good reading can act as spiritual sign posts and traps for the unwary. Join us if you can.

Pope Francis to LGBT Catholics

In a handwritten letter, in Spanish, is dated May 8, Pope Francis said he wants LGBT Catholics to know that God is a father who "does not disown any of his children".

The Pope's comment was among the short answers to three questions posed in a letter by Jesuit Fr James Martin, editor of *America* magazine and its new website, outreach.faith, which provides news and resources for LGBT Catholics, their families and the people who minister with them.

Fr Martin asked the Pope, "What do you say to an LGBT Catholic who has experienced rejection from the Church?" "I would have them recognise it not as the 'rejection of the Church,' but instead 'of people in the church,'" the Pope responded. "The Church is mother and calls together all of her children," he continued. "Take for example the parable of those invited to the feast: 'the just, the sinners, the rich and the poor, etc.'" A church that is "selective," or makes some pretext about who is "pure," he said, "is not the Holy Mother Church, but rather a sect".

Asked what the most important thing LGBT people should know about God, Pope Francis responded, "God is Father and he does not disown any of his children. And 'the style' of God is 'closeness, mercy and tenderness.' Along this path you will find God."

The third question was, what would Francis like LGBT people to know about the Church, to which the Pope responded that they should read the Acts of the Apostles. "There they will find the image of the living Church."

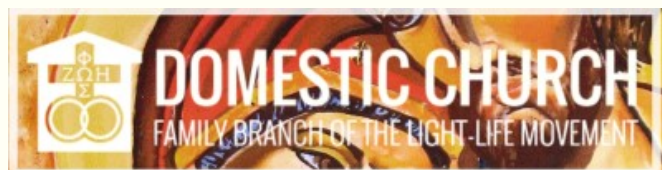

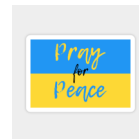
