



Remembering the past: Terrigal Parish's 50th Anniversary

My new husband, Bruce, and I attended Mass in Terrigal for the first time when we were on our honeymoon in November 1951. The Mass was celebrated in the old picture theatre in Kurrawyba Avenue, up the hill from where the Crown Plaza now stands. The hotel was smaller then, and called the Florida Hotel, and you can just see it in the background.

After that, Bruce's work took us to Queensland and Victoria, and we didn't return to Terrigal until 1973. Father Joiner visited us, and we tried to get our three daughters into the Star of the Sea Primary School, but there was only one space available. That was the only class we didn't need! So, our children had to attend the State school at Erina Heights.

Our eldest daughter was married in 1982 and Mons Marley officiated. Two other daughters were also married from Star of the Sea, with Mons Marley and then Father Borg officiating.

My husband was keen fisherman, and the very tall pine tree which stood in the grounds of the "church on the hill" was a "mark" for him and other fishers to find a productive fishing ground.

My husband died in 1989, and his funeral was held at that church, I was very grateful to Pauline Maniskas who completely took over the organization of the wake at our house, as I was out of my depth.

Two of our grandchildren were baptised and later went to the old school and, while many parishioners (including me) were sorry to have to leave our beautiful church, realized the parish family had grown extensively, and the children attending the school there really had no playground.

More grandchildren arrived, they attended the new Star of the Sea School, and the school fete was always well attended and lots of fun.

Safeguarding

Christmas can be a tough time for some children and young people because expectations are high and there is pressure from peers and at school to 'have a good time'. As many people will know, family relationships can be fraught, distant and a source of pain. The idealised images of happy families around the dinner table that feature in Christmas advertising and the media at this time of year can be unrealistic. There is a darker side to the festive season that we *must* consider and that is recognising that some children are having a miserable time. Frontline services usually experience spikes in child protection issues in December due to several issues including a lack of finances, custody disputes, parental drug and alcohol abuse, domestic and family violence, and homelessness.

The KIDS Helpline 2021 Annual Report recorded a peak of 36% of children contacting them in December requiring ongoing support. Their 2022 report recorded children as young as 5 years of age contacting them. If you know a child who is at risk of significant harm, regardless of whether you are a mandatory reporter or not, please report to the **Child Protection Helpline on 132 111**.
