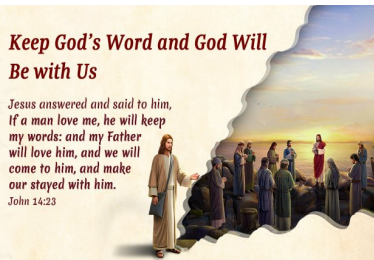

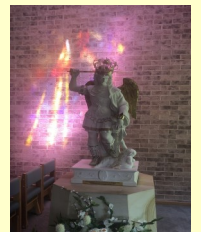

Why the name Leo?

The Pope said there were various reasons for choosing his papal name, "but mainly because Pope Leo XIII, in his historic encyclical *Rerum Novarum*, addressed the social question in the context of the first great industrial revolution".

Rerum Novarum was written in 1891, addressing the conditions of the working classes and dealing with various social issues. It is widely hailed as having laid the framework for the Catholic Church's modern social doctrine and its position on social issues, which were a bedrock of Pope Francis's pontificate.

"In our own day, the Church offers to everyone the treasury of her social teaching in response to another industrial revolution and to developments in the field of artificial intelligence that pose new challenges for the defence of human dignity, justice and labour," Pope Leo said.

Men's Bushwalking Group

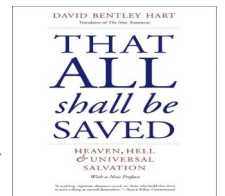

In June we will be reading Brant Pitre's book "Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist". 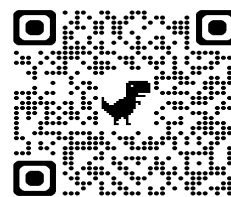
