The Pope's visit to Africa

The recent visits by the Pope to the Democratic Republic of the Congo and South Sudan are enormously informative.

Black Africa, what is commonly known as sub-Saharan Africa, is an area of great growth for the Catholic Church. The Church is under serious challenge by secularism in Western countries such as Europe, North America and Australia. However, it has grown at an extraordinary rate in sub-Saharan Africa.

In a number of countries over 50% of the population is Catholic and Church attendance rates are high – equivalent to what our church was in Australia the 1950s and 1960s. Huge crowds, well over 1 million in some cases, seen on TV cheering the Pope are indicative of the church's strength.

Two clear messages emerge from the Pope's visit relevant to us in Australia:

Firstly, his ecumenism. He took with him the Archbishop of Canterbury, the symbolic head of the Anglican Church community and the Moderator of the Church of Scotland, the symbolic head of Presbyterian churches. After the Catholics the Anglicans and Presbyterians are the largest Christian denominations in the English-speaking sections of black Africa such as South Sudan. The Pope shows his commitment to sharing the Christian gospel and to gradually dismantling the barriers between the Christian churches.

Secondly, his welcome to LGBTI people. The Pope made clear his commitment that the Gospel is for all and that all are welcome to Christ's kingdom. What made his public commitment significant is the fact that in most black African countries same-sex relationships are still criminal offences. In this sense was going contrary to both local law and custom to so publicly proclaim the Gospel. As he has famously said on previous occasion: "who am I to judge"?

Book Club

At the end of February the bookclub will be discussing Elizabeth Lev's book *How Catholic Art Saved the Faith-The Triumph of Beauty and Truth in Counter-Reformation Art*. Part history, part art appreciation, reading the book is a reminder of a comment made by Pope Benedict XVI to clergy in 2008; 'art and the saints are the greatest apologetic for our faith'. The book covers a period of great turmoil in the church. Art became an effective means of explaining the sacraments to a largely unlettered public, and the church enlisted the skill of some of the greatest artists of the era. The book is a real treat for the eye and the soul as Peggy Noonan noted. In March we will be revisiting the author Sally Read who wrote a beautiful book about the Annunciation. For April we will be reading and discussing Rabbi Jonathon Sacks book *The Persistence of Faith: Religion, Morality and Society in a Secular Age*.

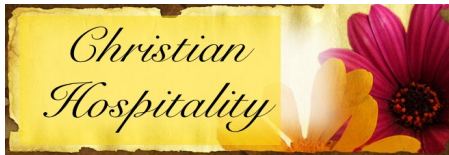

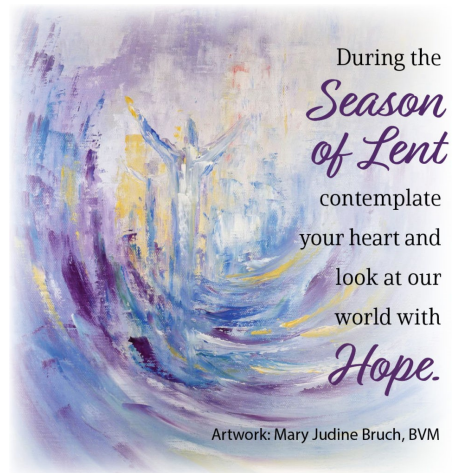
