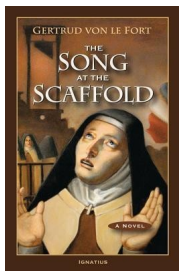

Saint John Paul II is a



particularly cherished saint for many. For many Catholics through the late 20th century, he was a constant part of their lives. Born Karol Wojtyła in Poland in 1920 and living through the Nazi occupation of Poland during his early adulthood, he ascended to become Pope, serving as the Pontiff for almost three decades.

As Pope, he visited Australia twice, once in 1986 and once in 1995, for the beatification of Saint Mary MacKillop. For many people in Australia, he is the only saint they would have ever seen in the flesh.

His feast day on October 22 represents a special day of devotion for many people, venerating a saint they knew and lived alongside.

Unlike most saints, who are venerated on their death date, Saint John Paul II is venerated on the date of his inauguration as Pope: October 22. His inauguration in 1978 coincided with World Mission Sunday, which we celebrate this weekend. Saint John Paul II recognised World Mission Sunday as a critical day for the Church, which allowed it to renew its commitment to missionary work throughout the world.

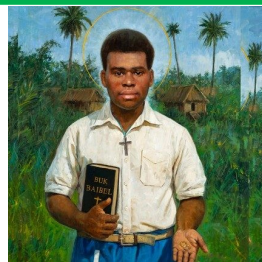

Pope's Prayer Intention for October 2025



During the month of October, Pope Leo invites us to pray for collaboration between different religious traditions. Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice, and human fraternity..

Collections

We will no longer be using the long poles connected to the collection bags for our two collections.

When it is time for the collection, the person taking up the collection will take two bags to the front pew of the middle isle and hand a bag to the person in the front pew, who will pass it to the next person in the pew; and when it reaches the last person in the pew they will turn and hand it to the person in the pew behind them.(You may need to stand and move to reach the person beside or behind you.) The collector will follow the bags as they move towards the back of the church and retrieve each bag when it has been passed along the back pew.

After that, each collector will take one of the bags to the pews in front of the statues of Mary and St Michael; and then to the servers' sacristy.

New School Building

There is still some work to be done on site before all the work associated with the new building is finished.

- The demountable classrooms, which are no longer being used, will be moved off site on 7 November. Hopefully the shipping containers will also be moved about the same time.
- Repair work will soon be done to the gardens and carpark surface near the bus shed. This area will be cut off from the rest of the carpark during this work, so please take care.
- A fence will be built from the new building to the ELC, to keep the students and their play area separate from the carpark and moving vehicles. There will be gates onto the parish oval to allow for extra parking when it is needed.
- And the bush area at the top of the school, near the rubbish and re-cycling bins, is in the process of being repatriated. This will take a while.

Pope Leo XIV

has released his first Apostolic Exhortation, *Dilexi te*, "I have loved you" – Revelations 3:9 - which describes prejudice against the poor as an "inescapable challenge".

Pope Francis had begun writing the document in his final months of life. Pope Leo decided to make it his own with the addition of some reflections on the theme of love for the poor.

"Not infrequently, our prosperity can make us blind to the needs of others and even make us think that our happiness and fulfilment depend on ourselves alone, apart from others.

"In such cases, the poor can act as silent teachers for us, making us conscious of our presumption and instilling within us a rightful spirit of humility," Pope Leo writes.

Bishop Anthony encourages us all to prayerfully read *Dilexi te*, and consider how we can apply its words to acts of mercy and service in our everyday lives.
