

Next month we will be discussing Faith Maps by Michael Paul Gallagher an Irish Jesuit who 'translates' the thoughts of a number of leading thinkers who have explored the credibility of faith. It is a useful introduction to theology and religion. He covers writers such as Ratzinger, Newman, Flannery O'Connor, Karl Rahner Hans Urs von Balthasar and others. It should be an interesting discussion.


Synod

The privilege and responsibility of a spiritual director is to journey with you, in one-on-one conversations, as you deepen your relationship with God. What is shared is held in confidence.

A meeting time is agreed upon, usually once a month, for an hour.



The Synod of Bishops is reaching its halfway point. The overall theme is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission. During the first week, around 460 participants met in small groups to discuss the first part of Instrumentum Laboris, the document guiding discussions which were centred on "For a Synodal Church: An Integral Experience" and the experience of the people of God journeying together over the last two years. This second week the gathering switched from small groups to a plenary assembly with the theme "A communion that radiates". 
