**Easing of COVID restrictions**

We are now able to gather in the church for the **celebration of Mass and the sacraments**, and we have returned to our pre-lockdown timetable. **Devotions** such as Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet and the St Michael Prayer Group may also resume, if they are meeting in the church.

**COVID-safe practices** are required in the church.

**Funerals and weddings** in the church can have 217 people. (The limit is 10 people if an unvaccinated person is attending.)

In the **celebration of Mass** there can be no congregational singing, although a choir of up to 10 fully vaccinated people can sing. There will be no communion from the chalice and those wanting communion on the tongue as asked to come at the end of the line.

Only those who are also fully vaccinated may visit the **parish office or hall**. Please register with the QR code when you arrive and wearing masks is recommended.

**From 1 December** there will be even less restrictions and we will be settling into the new normal with COVID-19 in the community.

As **an act of love and a sign of welcome**, let's make our church as safe as possible for everyone. Please stay safe yourself and let's keep each other safe.

The NSW parliament has started to debate a bill legalising euthanasia in our state. The church has consistently been against the taking of human life and in the debate high standard palliative care is rarely presented as a positive alternative.

I visit it almost every Saturday, when I am on call for the Hospital, to anoint Catholics who are approaching the end of life. It is always a positive experience for the patient, the family and myself. They also provide wonderful palliative care in the home.

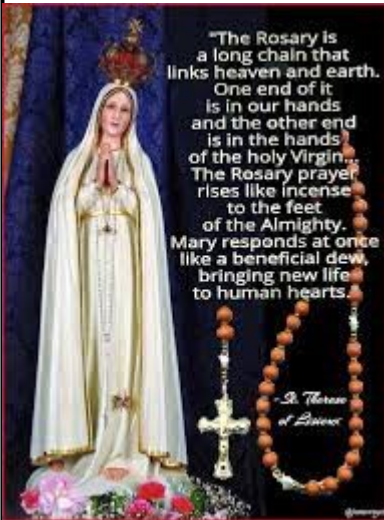

## Plenary Council 2021



The first session of the Council has come and gone. On analysis it has done a reasonable job. It has opened up debate and for the first time ever has allowed laypeople to engage in dialogue with the bishops on the problems facing the church in Australia. Solutions must come at further sessions. However, the first session did outline the problems. They are enormously challenging, but the church has faced greater challenges in its 2,000 year history and overcome them.

The process designed by the organisers did allow for a number of different expressions of how Catholics in the 21st-century look to their church and understand their faith. Notwithstanding this, the crisis facing the church remains to be confronted. Partially this is the fault of the church as the terrible abuse of children shows. Partially it is the age in which we live in western societies where the value of religious faith has massively declined and the Media/ political class disparage religion, especially Christianity.

Of all the people in the world Pope Francis seems to understand this the best. He wants a church to change from its traditional position of assertion to one mission. He wants a church that emphasises the mercy and compassion of our Saviour rather than one that simply lays down the law. What the Pope seeks is a change of culture throughout the universal church. This is no small thing. At 85 he knows this is not going to be achieved in his lifetime but he is determined to lay the foundations. The visible proof of this is his calling of the worldwide Synod of Bishops for 2023. A Synod where he looks to root and branch reform. A reform based upon the discernment of all Catholics throughout the world, both practising and non-practising.

Australia, though small in the worldwide church, has potentially a significant role to play in that it can develop models of governance and mission which can be an example to other Catholic churches. In 2020, to their credit, the bishops published the "Light from the Southern Cross." This document outlines measures to improve church governance and to instil contemporary standards of accountability and transparency. It could well be the framework for the next session of the Plenary Council in July 2022.

The President of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference, Archbishop Coleridge, recently told the ABC radio program *The Religion and Ethics Report*:

"I think the monarchical exercise of episcopal control that gathered to itself the culture of secrecy that was so brutally exposed in the royal commission has got to go."

This is the most senior cleric in Australia, the person chosen by his fellow bishops to be the symbolic head of the church in Australia, stating that the present model of governance solely by bishops is no longer relevant. The church has had many models of governance throughout its history but the most relevant model is that practiced by Jesus Christ himself. It is that model that the Pope seeks to return the church to - a missionary church where all baptised play their part in proclaiming the Gospel. *Chris Hartcher*

### **Blessed Chiara Luce Badano Feast 29 October**

Even at the age of four, Chiara seemed aware of the needs of others. She would sort through her toys to give some to poor children, and she would never give away just the old or broken ones. She invited less-fortunate people into the family's home for holidays and visited the elderly at a retirement center. When other children were sick and confined to bed, Chiara visited them. She loved the stories of the Gospel and loved to attend Mass.

When she was 9, Chiara became involved with the Focolare movement and its branch for young people. Focolare emphasizes brotherhood and unity among all people.

Chiara was very popular, had lots of friends, she played sports, and she loved to sing and dance. When once asked, she said she did not try to bring Jesus to her friends with words, she tried to bring Jesus to them with her example and how she lived her life. When she was 17, Chiara learned she had a very serious form of bone cancer.

Treatments were painful and unsuccessful. She became paralyzed. One day someone asked her if she hoped to walk again, and her answer was no. When she suffered, she felt closer to Jesus. She even refused to take pain medication that would make her too sleepy to continue to live her life.

Despite her illness and being confined to bed, Chiara wrote letters and sent messages to others. She attended Focolare youth meetings. She inspired everyone who she encountered with her faith and love for others. She gave all her savings to a friend who was becoming a missionary in Africa. When her life was nearly at an end, she said, "I have nothing left, but I still have my heart, and with that I can always love."

Chiara died in 1990. Within nine years, the bishop of her diocese began the work on her cause for canonization. Pope Benedict XVI declared her "Blessed" in 2010. "Only Love with a capital L gives true happiness," and that's what Chiara showed her family, her friends and her fellow members of the Focolare movement, the pope said.

She was a normal, everyday girl, and possibly a normal, everyday saint.

Chiara's brief life showed us how much one person can accomplish in God's name.

## Synod of Bishops 2021-2023

In March 2020, Pope Francis announced that the theme for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops would be "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission".

The actual Synod of Bishops gathering will be held in October 2023, however, the journey towards its celebration begins this month.

This 2-year process allows a period of wide consultation and walking together as a worldwide Church: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium. This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. Our "journeying together" is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God."

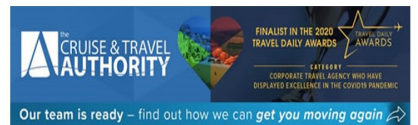
