## **Euthanasia**

The Euthanasia legislation passed its first hurdle this week in the NSW Legislative Assembly. It now goes to the Legislative Council, the upper house. It is expected that the Legislative Council will deal with the bill in February 2022. It is expected to pass through without difficulty. To allow for the development of procedures and inevitable regulations euthanasia will probably come into practice in early 2023.

This will mean that for the first time in its history the NSW Parliament has sanctioned assisted suicide. It will inevitably also mean a downgrading of the value of human life. The present parliament elected in 2019 has an extraordinary and appalling record. Abortion was officially legalised in 2019 and now euthanasia in 2021/2222. Disappointingly all four Central Coast members of Parliament in the legislative assembly supported the legislation.

Despite claims that the law will contain safeguards to prevent abuse, experience overseas shows these are gradually watered down. Overseas experience also shows that the alternative to euthanasia, palliative care, is also gradually reduced. Unsurprisingly experience shows problems relating to pressure and indeed coercion by impatient family members. It shows also that the legislation by downgrading the value of human life sends a message to people that suicide is acceptable solution to personal problems. In New South Wales suicide of males under the age of 30 is the principal cause of death, bigger than any other cause and far bigger than road accidents. Ironically a royal commission is presently investigating suicide among defence personnel and veterans with the aim of developing preventative policies.

Pope John Paul II in condemning euthanasia decried that modern society was replacing a culture of life with a culture of death. Throughout the centuries the Catholic Church has sought to maintain the dignity of human life and to acknowledge it is a gift from God. Catholic Church teaching on life has its foundation in the divine commandment: thou shalt not kill.

Catholic medical practitioners, Catholic Hospitals and retirement homes now face potentially difficult decisions. Tragically this is not unusual. It is summarised in the story of the early church, as set out in the Acts of the Apostles (5.29): "But Peter and the apostles answering, said: we ought to obey God, rather than men."
