Communion from the Chalice

We are now able to receive Holy Communion from the chalice. You can choose to receive Communion under the form of bread or wine, or both. There will be one chalice available at weekday Masses and two chalices at Sunday Masses. When the chalice is empty, the minister will return it to the altar, so if it is important for you to receive from the chalice, do not wait till the end of communion.

Collections

As all the restrictions in the Church due to COVID have been lifted, we are no longer using the 2 metre poles to take up the collections. These are too dangerous and do not reach the middle of the pew. There has been some confusion about what to do, so here is the suggestion about what will work best. Thank-you for your assistance in this.

The collectors move to begin the first collection as soon as we sit after the Prayers of the Faithful, and the second collection as soon as the communion line is finished. (Do not wait for the tabernacle to be closed.) They take two bags down the side isles (the ones we use to walk back to our seats after Holy Communion) and hand a bag to the person in each of the front pews.

Those in the pews take the bag and pass it to the next person in the pew and when it reaches the last person in the pew you turn and hand it to the person in the pew behind you. (You may need to stand and move to reach the person beside or behind you.)

The collector will follow the bags as they move towards the back of the church and retrieve each bag when it has been passed along the back pew. He or she will then take one of the bags to the pews in front of the statues of Mary and St Michael; and then take both the bags to the servers' sacristy.

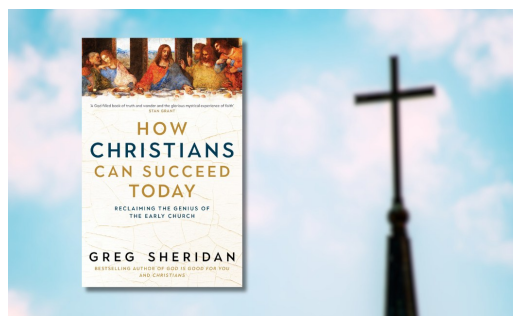

Our book club will commence for 2026 at the end of this month. As has been usually the case, we meet on the last Friday of every month at 1600 in the parish offices. With a religious tradition spanning two millennia there are many potential titles to choose from spanning literary classics, history and culture, theology and catholic apologetics, conversion narratives, the writings of mystics, contemporary writers and writers ancient and medieval.

For this month we will be reading Greg Sheridan's latest book "**How Christians Can Succeed Today**". The book is divided into two parts, the first recalls the history of persecution of the early church that yet survived and flourished. The second half of the book, through stories of modern Christians, reminds us that we have been in our present predicament before and survived. A deeply encouraging book.

In February we will be reading Rabbi Jonathon Sacks book "**A Letter in the Scroll**".

In March we will read Tolstoy's "**A Confession**", a book he wrote in his early fifties. Thankfully it is nowhere nearly as long as his other writings.

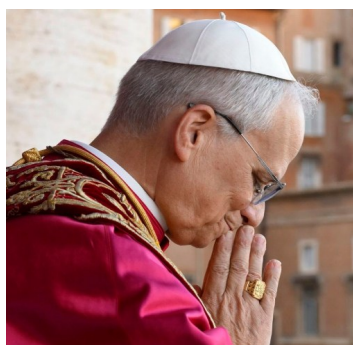
