Parish Meeting: Saturday 12 February at 2pm in Parish Hall

Your attendance is requested. Why?

As Catholics every one of us is called to witness to the faith and to practice it. Evangelising, that is spreading the good news of the gospel, is a call for all of us. The issue is how do we do this?

Our Bishop is anxious to update the message of the Church in the Diocese of Broken Bay and has chosen the Central Coast as the pilot area. He is keen to hear our views and work with us. He does not pretend to have all the answers to the continuing falling away of Catholics from observance of their faith. He wants to hear the contribution of every parishioner on the Central Coast, especially, where possible, those who no longer practice the faith in the sense of attending Sunday Mass or receiving the sacraments.

Hence, he has called each Central Coast parish, including our own, to meet, to discuss and to listen and, most importantly, to develop ideas and programs which he can take forward. He hopes to receive the views of every parish by 31 March 2022.

At his request and conscious of our own obligations to be witnesses for Christ the parish we have scheduled a general meeting for Saturday 12 February from 2pm to 4pm in the parish hall.

The purpose of this meeting is not to discuss parish matters as such but to take a wider view and look at how the Catholic message can best be spread on the Central Coast. We will be subdivided into small groups, each group led by a facilitator, to discuss, listen and present our ideas. Seventeen parishioners have generously agreed to be facilitators.

Please make every effort to attend. If any of your family and friends are interested in attending, please invite them. There are no right or wrong views. Every view from every parishioner should be and will be heard and listened to with respect.

We believe the Holy Spirit guides the Church and will do so till the end of time. However, it is up to us to seek His guidance and to act upon it.

Bookclub

Scott Hahn's book Evangelizing Catholics: A Mission Manual for the New Evangelization was the subject matter of our bookclub which met last Friday. There was so much to discuss, it was decided to continue with the same book next month.

It is a book divided into three sections. Part 1 is about understanding what the new evangelization is about. Part 2 is about how to evangelise, while the final section spoke to the question of what we are evangelizing.

As a convert to Catholicism Scott Hahn has an interesting perspective on evangelization. Having joined us from an evangelical tradition he has noted the cultural differences between the Protestant faith and Catholicism. Catholics he writes are not comfortable proselytising. He hints at a number of reasons. We don't know our faith so are uncomfortable being challenged and answering questions. In Australian we are part of a culture with a long history of anti-Catholicism. We tend to equate evangelization with televangelists and are suspicious of their ministry. We are increasingly uncomfortable with religious triumphalism and increasingly we relegate our faith to the private domain.

This has occurred simultaneously with interest in other religions. Rabbi Jonathan Sacks noted about Judaism: "Starting in the sixties", he writes, "Jews made their way into many religions and cultures with one notable exception: their own." Despite a rich tradition of mystics and meditators, poets, philosophers, visionaries and prophets, holy men and women, the spiritual grass for many Jews was greener elsewhere. The same occurred in our Catholic tradition. Scott Hahn's book demystifies the task belonging to the whole church of strengthening our faith by giving it to others. "Good News is too great to keep to ourselves."

We only touched the surface of this rich resource. There is still much left to discuss, but as Pope Francis has written in The Joy of Gospel "The Church which goes forth is a community of missionary disciples who take the first step...An evangelizing community knows that the Lord... has loved us first and therefore we can move forward, boldly take the initiative, go out to others, seek those who have fallen away, stand at the crossroads, and welcome the outcast.

The bookclub will meet next at 1600 hrs on 25th February in the parish office where we will continue the discussion of Evangelizing Catholics. In March we will be challenging ourselves with Chesterton's wonderful book Orthodoxy. "Merely having an open mind is nothing. The object of opening the mind, as of opening the mouth, is to shut it again on something solid."


