
my weaknesses, and with insults, hardships, persecutions, and the agonies I go through for Christ's sake. For it is when I am weak that I am strong.

Gospel : St Mark 6:1-6

Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpen-

ter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. Lockdown

The church is closed and there are no Masses or services till Saturday 10 July. The meeting rooms and hall are also closed. There is no obligation to attend Sunday Mass during this time of lockdown.

The communication we received from the Bishop on Saturday 26 June is below. We will provide more information when we have it.

The current COVID outbreak in Sydney has intensified significantly overnight which has lead the Premier to place a stay at home order for the Greater Sydney Area, including Central Coast, Blue Mountains and Wollongong, effective from 6pm Saturday 26 June 2021, through to at least 11:59pm 9 July 2021.

In light of this, and in order that our people be kept as safe as possible, I ask that **all our churches in Diocese of Broken Bay be closed from 6pm this evening, 26 June 2021**. Since this is at my request, the obligation for the faithful to participate in Sunday Mass (can.1247) is lifted for the people of Broken Bay for the duration of this stay at home order. I will review the situation as we approach 9 July or if the stay at home order is lifted earlier. I would encourage you to resume livestreaming the Mass where possible. This service continues to be made available from our Cathedral on Sunday mornings at 9.30AM as well as weekdays at 7AM.

I am particularly mindful of the disruption in people's lives and plans that this development will occasion, cause distress once again for our people. I hold you all in my prayer, asking that the Lord may keep us all safe during this time.

Book Club 25/06/21

Teachings for an Unbelieving World: Newly Discovered Reflections on Paul's Sermon at the Areopagus. Archbishop Karol Wojtyla.

Our book club started this latest session with a reading of Saint Paul's sermon at the Areopagus, prior to a discussion of Pope Saint John Paul II's reflections on this important event in Saint Paul's missionary activity. Paul the zealous Pharisee steeped in the tradition and wisdom of the Torah, a persecutor of Jesus' followers, and a collaborator in the stoning of

Stephen, has undergone a radical conversion on the road to Damascus. His life and ours has been irrevocably changed as a consequence. He is by all accounts extraordinarily knowledgeable. His knowledge of Scripture allows him to defend the universality of the message of the resurrected Christ. He is on his own turf when he defends his position within the Jewish tradition, but when he arrives in Athens he finds a culture largely ignorant of Jewish tradition. It is within this tradition that he has to defend himself, and so we have the sermon at the Areopagus, and consequently the reflections by JPII.

The discussions were fascinating. It was allowed that the book was a challenging undertaking. The reflections were written in 1965 while Wojtyla was active in Vatican II. The origins and intended audience of these reflections were unknown but they were probably intended for seminarians. Friday afternoon Terrigal pre-lockdown (but with an enthusiastic readership) was probably not his intended audience. Someone once said that knowledge hath a bloody entrance. I think it was safe to say that blood was spilt but in the nicest possible way.

The next book to be tackled is a conversion story. It is brilliantly and beautifully written by Sally Read. We hope you can join us.


Monday 12 Saints Louis I Zelie Martin

On October 18, 2015, Pope Francis canonized Louis and Zélie Martin, the parents of St. Thérèse of Lisieux. This is the first husband and wife to be canonized together, emphasizing their cooperation with the graces of the sacrament of matrimony. The Church celebrates their feast as an Optional Memorial on July 12.

Tuesday 13 St Henry

Wednesday 14 S Kateri Tekakwitha

Kateri was born in 1656 near the town of Auriesville, New York, the daughter of a Mohawk warrior. She was baptized by Jesuit missionary Fr. Jacques de Lambertville on Easter of 1676 at the age of twenty. She devoted her life to prayer, penitential practices, and the care of the sick and aged in Caughnawaga near Montreal (where her relics are now enshrined). She incurred the hostility of her tribe because of her faith. She was devoted to the Eucharist, and to Jesus Crucified, and was called the "Lily of the Mohawks." She died in 1680 and was beatified June 22, 1980 — the first native American to be declared "Blessed." She was canonized on October 21, 2012.



Thursday 15 St Bonaventure bishop

Bonaventure, born Giovanni di Fidanza, was an Italian medieval Franciscan, scholastic theologian and philosopher. The seventh Minister General of the Order of Friars Minor, he was also Cardinal Bishop of Albano. He was influenced by St Augustine of Hippo
