

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

What is the difference between a "Saint" and a "Blessed"?

Answer:

The process of proclaiming someone as a saint in the Catholic Church has evolved over the course of many centuries. In the beginning, those honoured as saints were almost exclusively biblical figures or martyrs. However, after the legalisation of Christianity in the fourth century, new holy women and men came to be honoured as saints, and this was often done by popular acclaim or by the local bishop or abbot.

It was Pope Gregory IX (who was pope from 1227 to 1241) who officially proclaimed that only the pope had the authority to add someone to the official list (the "canon") of saints. This is the meaning of the word "canonisation."

Today, the saint-making process includes several steps, including detailed studies of the person's life and a recognition that they died as a martyr or lived a life of "heroic virtue." Once someone is recognised as a martyr or if a miracle is attributed to their intercession, they will be beatified and honoured as "Blessed." This means that they can be celebrated by Catholics in a particular country or region or by the members of certain religious community. If another miracle occurs and is approved, then the "Blessed" is canonised and honoured with the title "Saint," meaning that they are now officially recognised as a universal model of holiness and an intercessor.

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

When Jesus began his ministry he worked miracles not to prove who he was, and certainly not to show off his power. Jesus healed people because his heart was filled with compassion. At times Jesus might even have felt that the miracles were getting in the way. Jesus had something important to tell the people, and he didn't need them distracted.

When Jesus heals the leper he asks him to tell no one. He is aware of what will happen if the story of another healing gets around. People will swarm him. And that is exactly what happened. When the leper told people how he was cured, Jesus had to retreat, staying outside of the town.

I know I used to feel like that sometimes when all five children were home. It seemed like there was always someone wanting something from me. The requests were endless. "Mom can you fix this zipper, bake some cupcakes, find my socks, make me a costume..." — and all of that before breakfast. Like Jesus I also had to retreat even if it was just to a locked bathroom.


That was the strategy that got me through the day retreat and prayer. Lunchtime was the best; a few peanut butter and jelly sandwiches and *Sesame Street* would usually give me twenty minutes to pray and get myself centred again. Think about how many times Scripture tells us Jesus left his friends to go off for some quiet and prayer. If Jesus needed quiet prayer time, think how much more we do.

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

This Sunday's Gospel is about the leper who touches Jesus' heart. While leprosy isn't rampant in our communities today, many people suffer from the poverty of relationships which lepers suffered in Jesus' time.

There are people in our own communities who have no one who loves them except God. And they may not experience God's love because they have no human love to help them recognise God's love. They are the lonely, the alienated; some are scared, or angry or wounded. Your challenge this week is to take the compassion in your heart beyond your immediate circle of loved ones and extend that compassion to someone who is alone. What can you do as a family or household to bring love into this person's life? And can you commit to making it more than a one-time act of kindness and care? How can you continue to let this person know that he or she is not alone in this world, that God loves them, and that you do, too?

"So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God." –1 Corinthians 10:31

It's so easy to forget to slow down, savour, and give thanks for the fruits of the earth which nourish us each day. As you eat this week, intentionally give glory to God through your gratitude for the sun, the rain, and the labourers who have all made your meal possible. Give thanks for your food, knowing that many people in this world go hungry.

The Season of Lent this year will commence on 14 February (Ash Wednesday).




