WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do Catholics have a pope?

Answer:

To help ensure that the community of disciples would remain united in a communion of love, Jesus entrusted the Apostles with special authority to teach, heal, and forgive sins in his name. And from among this group, Jesus chose Simon Peter to play a special role, designating him as the "rock" on which the Church was to be built. Peter "the Rock" became the visible sign of union within and among the Apostles. In time, as Peter and the other Apostles passed away, other men were chosen to take their place. The successors of St. Peter — who we honour as the first Bishop of Rome — and the successors of the other Apostles (the bishops) continued the work entrusted by Jesus to that first generation of Church leaders.

According to long-standing tradition, the successor of Peter was Linus, who was followed by Cletus, who was followed by Clement I, etc. This line of succession continues to Pope Leo XIV in our own time.

Over the centuries, these Bishops of Rome — who came to be known as the "pope" (from papa, which means "father" in Latin) — still continue to act as the "rock" of the Church and as the visible sign of unity for all the Catholic Christians. The pope, more than any other bishop, stands as the Church's primary teacher and as pastor of the Church throughout the world, helping to ensure that the Church remains what Jesus intended her to be: one, holy, catholic, and apostolic. FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

Gean me

We are overjoyed to hear of the election of our former Prior General as the new Pope. Pope Leo XIV has visited North Harbour Parish several times during his time as Prior General of the Augustinians, and his presence left a lasting impact on our community.

I also recall a fascinating story from my student days in the Philippines one of his formators in Chicago shared with us that Bob Prevost once worked as a dogwalker before joining the Augustinians. This small but meaningful anecdote reminds us that every journey to faith is unique and that humble beginnings can lead to great service in the Church.

Indeed, the election of Pope Leo XIV is a moment of profound joy and hope for the Church, especially for those of us who walk in the footsteps of St Augustine. His deep theological wisdom, pastoral care, and commitment to the search for truth resonate with the very heart of our Augustinian charism. Having welcomed him to North Harbour Parish on multiple occasions during his time as Prior General, we know firsthand his warmth, humility, and dedication to building strong communities rooted in Christ.

One of Pope Leo XIV's defining qualities is his passionate commitment to social justice—a value deeply ingrained in both the teachings of St Augustine and the legacy of Pope Leo XIII. It is likely that his choice of name reflects his desire to carry forward the spirit of *Rerum Novarum*, the great encyclical of Pope Leo XIII that championed justice for workers and the poor. His leadership will undoubtedly be marked by a deep concern for the marginalized and a call to all Christians to engage actively in the mission of justice and peace.

As he takes up this new mission as the successor of St Peter, we pray that his leadership will guide the Church toward deeper unity, greater love, and

a renewed commitment to seeking truth with restless hearts. His election reminds us that we are all called to embody the Gospel with courage and joy, just as he has done throughout his ministry. May God bless him abundantly in this sacred responsibility, and may the spirit of St Augustine continue to inspire his pontificate.




