

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?

Answer:

This is an interesting question! During his earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and he is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good he does here on earth! ©LPi

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

As parents, we know how important it is to put up a united front. Children learn at a very early age whom to go to when they want certain things. And sometime before early adolescence, they also learn the technique of "divide and conquer." It is important for parents not to let their guard down.

After a few years of being married (or perhaps working through shared custody), as parents you will know what issues you tend to disagree about. Don't let your child take advantage of this knowledge. As parents, make a pact that when conflicts concerning the welfare of the children come up, you will discuss them before making any final decisions. For example, if a child comes to you with a request after she has already asked her other parent, simply respond: "We (your parents) will talk about (the request), later and we'll get back to you with *our* decision." Whether children know it or not, they need to have parents who back each other up.

I learned from my own parents to always show respect for my husband. In all of my growing up years, I never heard my dad or mom speak one word against the other. And my siblings and I certainly were not allowed to speak disrespectfully to or about them.


We were never allowed to call my mother, *she*, or my dad, *he*. My dad (who was from Poland), told us that every language except English had a distinct pronoun to use when speaking to people we were to respect. So Mom was always Mom and Dad was Dad. It was a habit my sisters and I formed when we were young and keep to this day. It was something my husband and I tried to teach our own children.

FAMILY RESPONSE:

The average Australian family only eats two meals a week with all family members present. If this is the case in your household, make those meals special. Don't argue, preach or watch TV at the table. Spend at least thirty minutes together at the table talking about your day, and afterward share the cleanup responsibilities.

PERSONAL RESPONSE:

Make sure you show respect for your spouse outside of your home, too. Try to limit talking about your spouse's bad points with others. Think about how your parents respected each other when you were growing up. Has this influenced the way you speak about your spouse? Do you feel respected by your spouse?

Then act on your prayer to release the power of the Holy Spirit in some real way.




