

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do we celebrate Pentecost when we do?

Answer:

The book of Acts unpacks the events immediately following Jesus' ascension into heaven. The Apostles and other disciples were told to pray in Jerusalem and await another outpouring of the Holy Spirit. As the weeks ticked on, the Jewish Festival of Weeks approached. This festival took place 50 days after Passover and celebrated the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. The Festival of Weeks (or "Pentecost" in Greek) was a great pilgrimage feast, with Jews from all over the ancient world convening on Jerusalem for the celebration.

It was on Pentecost that God chose to send the Holy Spirit. Here, the new law of love was etched into the hearts of the disciples. As he burst out onto the balcony above the multinational crowd, Peter proclaimed the message of the resurrection, and the Holy Spirit enabled every listener to hear in their native language. 3,000 people were baptized that day! The disciples and every baptized person receives the gifts and zeal necessary to bring a new message of salvation to the people of God.

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

Today, we celebrate Pentecost, the moment the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and ignited a mission of unity and evangelisation. This outpouring of the Spirit transformed a group of individuals into a community—a Church united not by sameness, but by a diversity of voices, languages, and cultures, made one in Christ.

Pope Leo's motto, *In illo uno unum*—"In the one Christ, we are one"—beautifully captures the essence of Pentecost. The Spirit enables us to embrace one another in communion, not despite our differences, but through them. Just as many voices spoke in many languages that day in Jerusalem, yet all understood, we too are called to be a Church where every culture, every tradition, and every person finds a home in Christ.

At the Catholic Community of North Harbour, we are blessed to reflect this same Pentecost spirit. Our multicultural parish is a living testament to the beauty of God's diverse creation, where every person, regardless of background, contributes uniquely to our shared faith. We are not strangers walking separate paths, but pilgrims journeying together in synodality, listening, learning, and growing as one. Pope Leo reminds us: "In the unity of the faith and baptism, our community is made one body." This unity does not erase our differences but celebrates them, allowing diversity to enrich our communion. When we listen to one another, we discover that unity is not uniformity—it is harmony, built through respect, dialogue, and love.

Our International Food Festival this Sunday is a joyful reflection of the Church's diversity, where cultures come together in a shared table, a shared story, and a shared faith. Let this feast remind us that just as many grains make one loaf and many grapes

make one cup, we—many and different—are made one in Christ. May the Spirit of Pentecost empower us to embrace one another with openness and humility, to walk forward together in synodality, and to become a Church that listens, loves, and serves as one.

On behalf of the entire parish team, we wish you a joyful and blessed Pentecost. May this celebration inspire us to continue fostering unity and communion in our faith community.

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES


The spirit of Pentecost celebrates the power of forgiveness. The Scriptures say that Jesus breathed on the apostles and gave them the power to forgive and to bind. God wants no one to be bound by sin, and extends forgiveness to all who are sorry and seek God's forgiveness. But

forgiving others is really hard when we are the victim of injustice. The challenge this week is to forgive so that you and your enemy will not be bound by sin. Forgiveness is a power of the Spirit, not a human power. If you find it hard to forgive, go deeper by doing what Jesus taught: pray goodness upon your enemy and do good for him/her.

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

"When you send forth your spirit, they are created; and you renew the face of the ground.
—Psalms 104:30

Take some deep breaths of fresh air on this day of Pentecost. This simple gesture has a great significance in our Christian tradition. Indeed, rhythmic breathing leads to deeper meditation, the grace of feeling God's presence. Sadly, one child in five suffers from asthma which can be caused or exacerbated by poor air quality in our cities, heavy pesticide use in agricultural areas, coal burning plants, and wildfires.



Elderly people are also more at risk for lung trouble when the air quality is poor too. Be thoughtful when the forecast calls for smog: avoid using your car if possible to reduce emissions especially on those days when the air quality is poor.




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
