

#### WHY DO WE DO THAT? **Catholic Life Explained**

#### Question:

This time of year, I attend a lot of weddings. Why do Catholic weddings need to take place in a church?

#### Answer:

Technically, there is a clause in Church law that could allow for weddings to take place outside of a church, in a suitable space under special circumstances, but it requires permission of the bishop. But the meaning of marriage goes very, very deep, and the Church has a vested interest in protecting that meaning. As Catholics, we don't see a wedding as an event that needs a pleasing backdrop.

Marriage is a sacrament, both an occasion of joyful promise and symbolic solemnity. It is a spiritual event. The loving bond of marriage symbolizes the mystical union between Christ and his Church. The man and woman profess lifelong vows of fidelity, and they receive supernatural grace from God to keep their promises. Receiving the sacrament of Marriage in a church has broader symbolic meaning for the couple as well. Marriage isn't simply two people in isolation from the world around them. Marriage is the joining of families and the beginning of a new, holy mission in the life of the couple. Weddings are sacred occasions, and it's fitting that they occur in sacred spaces. **©LPi**

#### **BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL**

Notice how Jesus begins the prayer he gives to his disciples, "Our Father." The Aramaic word Jesus uses is Abba, which is actually closer to "Daddy." Read the psalms or the prayers of the prophets. Nowhere is God referred to as *Father*, let alone the intimate term *Dad*. Jesus is inaugurating a new relationship with the Almighty. It is no longer, "Majesty," or "the God of Abraham and Isaac." God is *our* loving papa.

Jesus is asking his disciples to change their image of God. And the change is dramatic. God is not just a creator; God is a parent. We are not just creatures; we are beloved children. But notice the pronoun before *Father*.

God is not just mine, but *Our* Father. God is parent to the entire world. Jesus is making the point that we are all brothers and sisters of the same God, the God we are to call Father.

Through Abraham, God made a covenant with the Jewish people. God would always be with them. They would be God's chosen people. In Jesus, God makes a new covenant, a closer, more intimate covenant. God is not just with us, but also in us. We are God's children. Jesus is our brother not just on his mother's side, sharing our humanity, but also on his Father's side, sharing his divinity. We are all one family. And we must treat each other that way.

#### WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

Community gardens are getting popular. Do you know if you have one in your area? These gardens are usually a piece of land that is given to people or rented very inexpensively so they can grow food to feed their family. It is a good and holy thing to work with the earth, to plant seeds,

and to tend them while they grow into plants. Jesus used stories of farmers in Scripture – he spoke of seeds scattered, seeds that take root. He spoke of a small mustard seed that grows into a mighty plant. Your challenge this week is to seek out a garden in your community. Volunteer to help weed or water and support those who are caring for God's creation or feeding those most in need.

#### **CARE FOR CREATION TIPS**

"Give us each day our daily bread" —Luke 11:3

Jesus picks up on the Old Testament teaching about asking for and taking only what you need for the day, not hoarding and saving up things but trusting God will give you what you need tomorrow too. So many environmental issues are



caused by our overconsumption and hoarding more than we need to live on (food, gasoline, plastic stuff, fresh water, etc). What do you have more of in your home than you need or use? How can you cut back to just what you need in that category?

Wednesday mass at St Cecilia's **will not** be affected.






