

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why can't everyone who wants to receive Communion, receive Communion at Mass?

Answer:

Outside of the Church, many organisations have all sorts of requirements for membership: dues, achievements, professional standings, etc. The requirements bring the group together in common purposes and goals. Within the Church, there are also basic "requirements" for receiving the sacraments. As Catholics, we believe that the Eucharist is the true "Bread of Life." It is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. When we receive the Eucharist, we are receiving Jesus. Out of reverence for Christ, only those in union with this teaching and in a state of grace should receive communion. As Catholics, we should abstain from communion if we are in mortal sin. Receiving communion is not a right, but a gift to be accepted in humble, trusting faith.

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

Jesus tells the crowds following him that being his disciple can be costly. They have to be ready to accept the crosses of their lives, and perhaps even the scorn of their closest friends and relatives. They have to be ready to give up everything, if necessary, to follow him and his teachings."...[N]one of you can become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions" (v. 33)

Jesus is not suggesting that having possessions is wrong or that we should give up everything we own. He is saying that nothing of this world should be valued more highly than our relationship with him and with those we love.

I learned what this meant when my daughter was fourteen. One of my most precious possessions at that time was a beautiful porcelain statue from Spain that my husband had given me on a special anniversary. One day, while dusting the living room, my daughter dropped the statue and it broke.

The scene that followed is indelibly recorded in my head. I went into a rage and my wonderful only daughter ended up literally backed into a corner. In a graced moment, the fear in her eyes got through to me, and I stopped yelling. I realised that nothing was worth hurting this precious child the way I was hurting her. My initial reaction to the broken Lladro startled me. It was as though I valued that piece of porcelain more than my own child. I knew that wasn't true, but my response to its loss frightened me. From that day on, I decided I would never own anything that I wasn't ready to let go of in the blink of an eye. My Life has been a lot happier since then. I know I'm entitled to own nice things (and I have some beautiful keepsakes in my home), but

my things are not entitled to own me. How sad it is when our happiness depends on what we have or don't have. I think that is what Jesus meant when he said, "Happy are those who are poor in Spirit."

Are you attached to some things? What possession is most precious to you? Are brand names important when you shop? Why?

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
This Sunday's Gospel (Luke 14:25-33) challenges us to take up our cross and follow Jesus. In this same passage, we are called to renounce our possessions. That may seem a bit harsh—and really hard to do. But if we put the two messages together, we understand that taking up our cross

does require sacrifice. We can live up to this challenge by becoming less attached to things and more attached to people. Just as Jesus gave up everything—prestige, power, life itself—to redeem us, we are called to make sacrifices and give up things to help those in need. We do this because, we Catholics believe that people are more important than things. Your challenge this week is to choose one possession you have which takes up a lot of your time. It may be an electronic gadget, your television or your phone. Take the time you would have spent playing one game, listening to music, or watching a program, and spend the time instead being present to someone who needs companionship, listening to someone who never gets heard, or helping someone in need.

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

When travelling places like to work or school, let's consider the ideal method of transportation: walking, biking, scooting, or carpooling. We can ask ourselves: are there people going in the same direction? You could organise an informal "walking school bus" among neighbors or publicise it at your child's school, with an agreement to take turns leading a group of younger children from a designated meeting point at the same time each day. If you're traveling further, you could publicise your wish to form a carpool and share the cost of gas. Everyone wins by saving money, plus fewer cars on the road, less pollution, and less consumption of fossil fuels.




