

DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED

Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do Catholics eat fish on Friday?

Answer:

For centuries, meatless Fridays were the norm for Catholics throughout the world. Friday was chosen because that was the day on which Jesus died, and Christians wanted to find a way to honor that day with special prayers and acts of penance and self-denial.

The practice of abstaining from meat on Fridays — under pain of sin — grew out of that desire, and it became an official part of Church teaching until the time of the Second Vatican Council.

Today, Catholics throughout the world are still instructed to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. The bishops of some countries, such as in England and Wales, ask Catholics to abstain from meat every Friday, continuing the older tradition.

Regardless of what we choose to do, the real value in all of this is to see a reflection of Good Friday in each Friday, to remember the self-giving love of Jesus, and to honor that love through some sort of sacrifice or act of mercy.

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

It is such a simple statement of truth, "We cannot serve both God and money." But if we rephrase the question and ask, "How important is money to you?" the issue gets a little cloudier. Money is an important part of our lives.

There is no question that we need money to put food on the family table, clothes on our bodies and a roof over

our heads. Earning money to provide these things is definitely in the service of God. Even providing luxuries for ourselves and our families is okay, as long as we are also providing for people in need. But when money becomes an end in itself, buying becomes a way of life or having this year's model becomes a necessity, we are in trouble.

It is so easy to get caught up in the false notion that things can make us happy, even though we know that the pleasure they offer is temporary. Forever happiness is found in God's love and in our relationships with family and friends.

Every once in a while it's important to check out our priorities, and reevaluate our life style. There are at least two ways of doing this: taking a good look around our homes and paying attention to what we find ourselves talking about. Both can tell us a great deal about what is important to us and who we are really serving.

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WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES


The Responsorial Psalm this Sunday is: "Praise the Lord, who lifts up the poor" (Psalm 113). Numerous psalms praise God for caring for the poorest and most vulnerable in our world. They also invite us to be part of God's plan for bringing justice to all. Your challenge this week is to peruse the psalms until you find one which speaks to your family of God's compassion for the poor. (You can also use Psalm 113.) Every day this week, pray at least part of your chosen psalm as a family or household on behalf of a person or community struggling with poverty, hunger, or lack of shelter. Start on Sunday with someone in your neighborhood or local community. Each day stretch your prayer further afield so that you are praying for

global needs by the end of the week.

"No slave can serve two masters... You cannot serve God and wealth." —Luke 16:13

Many in our society serve the god of consumerism, perhaps unconsciously. They live as if there is an infinite supply of raw materials, but that belief is squeezing the planet dry and destroying our ecosystems. Make a commitment this week to refuse to make a purchase (except for groceries or other true essentials like healthcare supplies). Use your extra time, money, or the resources you save to do something positive that serves God instead.

A Mass of Anointing for the Sick and the Seniors


Everyone is invited for a mass of anointing for the sick and the seniors on Wednesday, 24 September, at 10:00 AM at St




