

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Who invented the Stations of the Cross?

Answer:

The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times and was a traditional walk for pilgrims who came to Jerusalem. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a minipilgrimage and follow in the footsteps of Jesus. This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread. Lent is a time when many people make the Stations and some churches present Passion plays or Living Stations. But anyone can pray the Stations at any time. It is a simple and personal reflection on the passion of Jesus and what it means to us. ©LPi

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

Some of the greatest theologians and saints once questioned the existence of God. It's not a sin to doubt our faith. Sometimes it's a healthy sign of growth. But it can be pretty scary when our youngsters begin questioning the truths we hold most sacred. My youngest son was fourteen when he put the question to me: "Mom, what if there isn't a God?" After some discussion about what he was thinking and feeling, I realised he was just as concerned about the fact that he was questioning as the question itself. I offered some advice that I've tried to follow myself: "As long as you keep honestly searching for the truth, you'll be fine."

This search for truth can be a lifelong adventure; questioning and even doubting are often a part of the process. Our job as parents is to lay a solid faith foundation so our children feel free to ask their questions, but also know where to look for answers. We do this from their earliest years by sharing Scripture and praying with them, by talking about what we believe and by taking them to church to worship, learn and serve with their peers and the larger parish. We cannot argue our children into faith. We cannot make them believe. We know they were gifted with faith at their baptism, and we can only trust that if they keep honestly searching for the truth, they will find it. In the end they will see God, because God is truth.

FAMILY RESPONSE:

Talk about the good deeds family members did last week. Ask each family member to think about the following question: "If you could ask God one question, what would it be?" Share your questions.

PERSONAL RESPONSE:

Is faith important to you? Why or why not? If it is important, in what ways do you model your faith at home?

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

October is the Month of the Rosary. We honor our Blessed Mother and focus on her role in the life of Christ through the Mysteries of the Rosary. The Second Joyful Mystery, the Visitation, reminds us of how Mary, even when she carried the Son of God in her womb, was still mindful of

others. She went in haste to visit and support her cousin Elizabeth, who in her old age was pregnant with John the Baptist. Your challenge this week is to pray this decade of the Rosary, then discuss who needs you to visit and support them. Then do it! At the end of the week, pray the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-56) and, like Mary, praise God for lifting up the meek and the lowly.

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

We celebrate the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi this week. Francis is without a doubt one of the most well-known and beloved saints in our tradition. He is particularly known for his love of creation so he is the patron saint of ecology. In honor of Francis, choose one thing, anything, you can do this week to protect our earth. It might be drinking tap water instead of bottled water, or recycling if you aren't already doing so, or walking or riding bikes instead of taking the car somewhere close. Then, at the end of the week, challenge yourselves as a family to continue the practice on a regular basis.






