

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained

Ouestion:

I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor. Who are they and what do they do?

Answer:

A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

What happened to those other nine lepers who were cured? Why didn't they come back to thank Jesus? I've given it some thought, and I have come up with nine reasonable rationalizations. Some sounded pretty familiar to my ears. You could probably come up with a few of your own. Here are mine:

- 1. I want to get back to my family or friends or work. He'll understand.
- 2. I'll do it later. Maybe I'll even write him a nice note.
- 3. It probably wasn't even a miracle. Maybe I just had a bad case of psoriasis.
- 4. Such a great guy doesn't expect thanks.
- 5. I have to get to the priest and do the required ritual, or the miracle might not last.
- 6. I never did anything to deserve getting leprosy, so I deserve the cure.
- 7. Why say thanks? Miracles are this guy's business.
- 8. I don't have time to double back.
- 9. I asked one of the other lepers to say thanks for me.

Teach your children not just to say "thank you," but to plant their feet firmly on the ground, look the person in the eyes and say the words meaningfully. A person who is truly grateful is a person who understands the give and take of relationships. They are also more likely to begin to appreciate the everyday gifts that surround them.


FAMILY RESPONSE:

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

Sunday's Gospel tells the story of the ten lepers (*Luke 17:11-19*), only one of whom returned to thank Jesus for being healing. Lepers were considered outcasts in Jewish society, sometimes being forced to wear bells around their necks to warn others of their approach so people

could avoid them completely. How starved for human contact they must have been! Jesus' healing of the lepers was more than a cure for a skin disease. He gave back to them the precious gift of interaction, of connection, of touch. Your challenge this week is to reach out to someone who has been rejected by others. It might be the kid at school whom everyone picks on, or the co-worker who messes up all the time, or the family on the block who doesn't keep their yard as tidy as the neighbors think they should. It might be a whole immigrant community. Whoever you choose, spend some time with this person or group, learning something about them which reminds you that they, too, are created in God's own image and likeness. They, too, deserve respect and dignity. Keep them in your prayers.

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

"So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean." —2 Kings 5:14 Are the lakes, rivers, ponds, or ocean near you clean enough to swim in or would you come out of the water dirtier than you went in? If you live near the water, take some time to go for a walk along the shoreline, take a trash bag with you, and pick up any litter you see. (Better yet, take a group of kids with you, or go with a friend or neighbor!) If you don't live near a waterway, write a letter or send an email to advocate for the clean-up and restoration of a body of water nearest you.




