VIRTUES, EXPLAINED!

Joy

Mini Explanation

Joy is the experience of achieving what we most desire — and what we most desire is love. God made us in love and for love, and so, in the same way that a flower seeks the sunlight, our souls seek the warmth of true, selfless love.

Joy, Explained!

Though it is often used as a synonym for happiness, joy has far more to do with the choices we make than the emotions we feel.

Joy is the experience of achieving what we most desire — and what we most desire is love. God made us in love and for love, and so, in the same way that a flower seeks the sunlight, our souls seek the warmth of true, selfless love. The virtue of joy, therefore, is a fruit of the virtue of love, or charity (CCC 1829).

“We are meant to have our human joys: the joy of living, the joy of love and friendship, the joy of work well done,” said Saint Pope John Paul II. “We who are Christians have a further cause for joy: like Jesus, we know that we are loved by God our Father. This love transforms our lives and fills us with joy.” ©LPi

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

There is a lesson in this Gospel for all of us. When your child was baptized, his real identity was also announced and celebrated. He, too, is a son of God. She, too, is God's daughter. They are beloved, and they please God very much. It is up to us parents to help our children understand that they please God just by being who God created them to be.

Being a parent today is a monumental job. We try to raise our youngsters to discover, develop, and treasure their own uniqueness while they are surrounded by a culture that wants to impose its own criteria of what is special and worth prizing. Because of this, we need to continually find ways to remind our children of how loved they are and how precious they are to God.

At the same time, we need to name for them the individual qualities we see in them that make them special. Do they have a great sense of humour? Do they listen well? Do they keep confidences? Perhaps they easily befriend many different kinds of children. Focus on qualities and not accomplishments. Try not to rely on grades in school or sports successes as your only affirmations.

Finding and naming your child's gifts is a lot easier to do when you can name and appreciate your own. When we feel secure in who we are, when we can name our own gifts, we are going to be much more comfortable helping our children name their own.

When we are certain of how precious we are in God's eyes, it will be much easier to convince our children of how precious they are.

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

The first reading for the Baptism of the Lord has the Prophet Isaiah proclaiming that the Messiah “shall bring forth justice to the nations”. Jesus fulfilled that passage by being a person of justice and teaching his disciples that all people deserve to be treated fairly and with dignity, including the poor, the sick and lame, the outcasts and sinners. Your challenge this week is to find a way to say “yes” to your baptismal call, just as Jesus said yes to his. What is Jesus calling you to do to live out your baptism? What injustice in your family or community or world are you being called to combat? And what can you do to help end it?

“Just as he came up from the water, suddenly the heavens were opened to him and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him.”—Matthew 3:16

Our Creator God uses creation to speak with us, send us messages, and inspire us. In the scripture story today, it’s with a dove. This week, take some time to notice birds in your neighbourhood, be they common sparrows, pigeons, crows or fantastic hummingbirds or owls. What can you do to support birdlife in your area? Perhaps you can install a bird feeder or bird bath, plant native plants to attract and feed native birds or learn bird identification which will lead to an increased appreciation for these beautiful winged creatures.

Volunteers are placed on a roster so you can choose how often you would like to volunteer for (eg. once or twice a term).

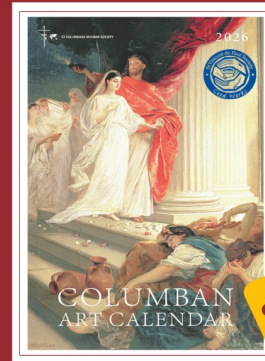

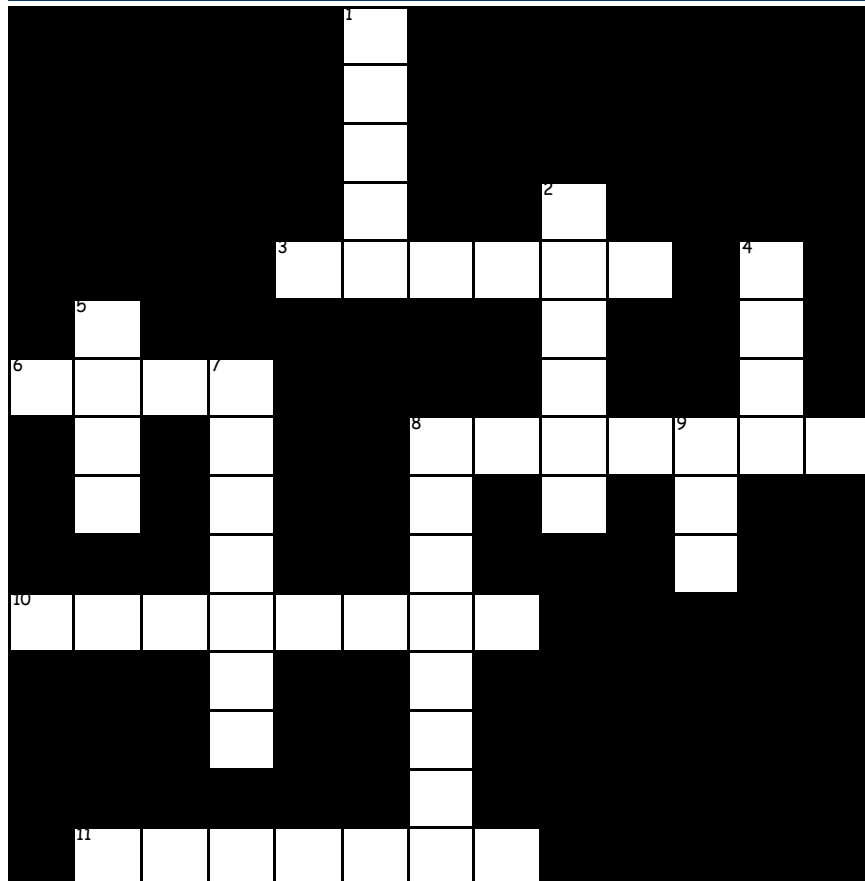
