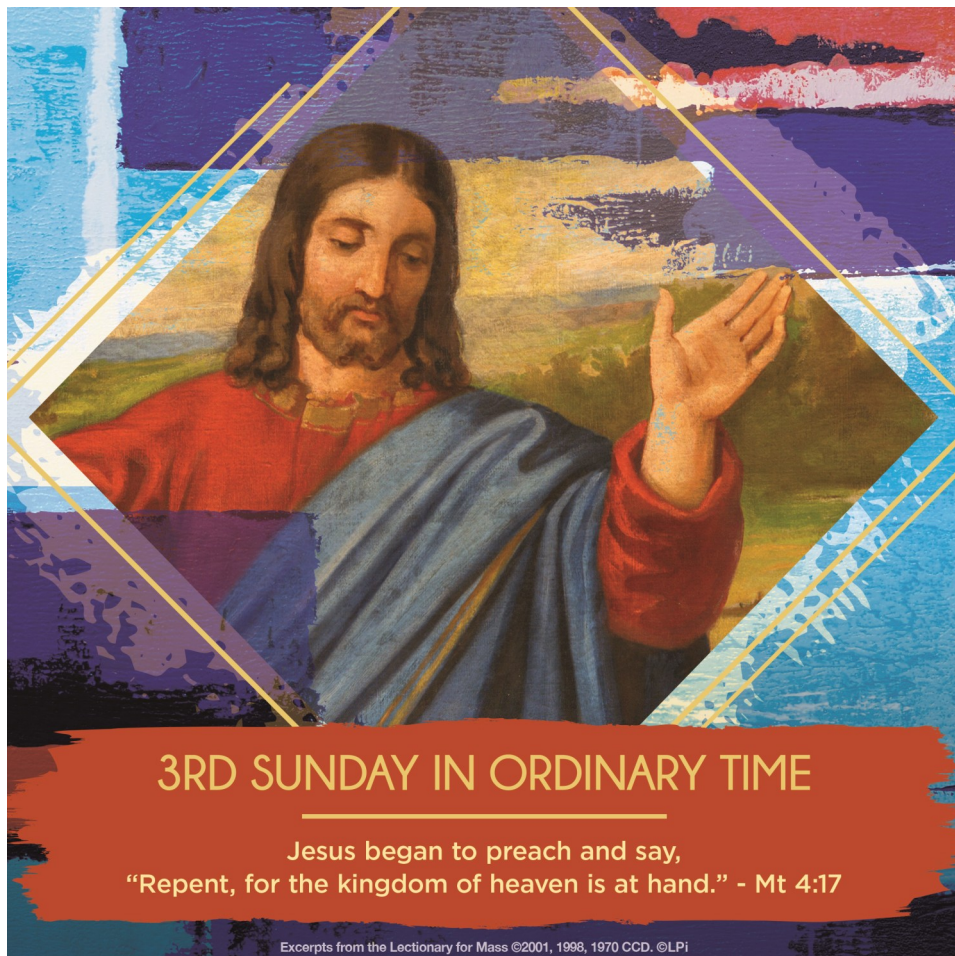

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained

Question:

If one's gift or talent is making money, and one uses that money for honorable purposes, is it considered a spiritual gift? What does our faith teach us about wealth and stewardship?

Answer:

Jesus said it best: to whom much is given, much is expected. All gifts come from God, and our abilities are given to us to be used for the benefit of ourselves and of others and at the service of the Gospel. In an article entitled "The Many Faces of Stewardship," Catherine Doherty wrote about stewardship in the "nitty-gritty everydayness of my life," and about the currency or "money" of spiritual stewardship: love, understanding, and unselfishness.

For a gift to have a spiritual benefit, our intention and involvement would be part of the consideration. If I give money to a charity, but do so in order to gain a tax advantage, it could hardly be a virtuous thing on my part. But if I give because I want to help and, in fact, am even willing to get involved, I have committed myself in a deeper, more meaningful way. Regardless of our money-making talents, in the end, true stewardship comes down to how well we practice the virtues of faith, hope, and love within our life and with those in our community and church. Ultimately, the most important element in stewardship is not intangible—it's you! ©LPI

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

Jesus begins his public ministry by announcing the coming of the kingdom. He tells us it's time to repent. Remember, the kingdom of God is not just the heaven we hope to get to after we die. The kingdom of God is also with us here, right now. The kingdom is any place or time where God's love is present and active.

Jesus was able to claim the kingdom was at hand because he brought the kingdom. Any place or time Jesus was present, there was the kingdom. As Christians, we are asked to be Christ today and bring the kingdom to our own time and place. That means we take Jesus' words to heart. We look at ways we can change for the better. We need to adjust how we act or how we react.

Think about what needs to change in your everyday family life for the kingdom to reign in your home. Begin with the surface things. Is the pace too fast? Is the noise level too high? Is there a constant attitude of "I'll get you back!"? We know that no amount of coaxing or nagging will change someone else if he or she isn't ready to change. And so as the grown-up in the household, change will have to begin with you.

Remember, with God's help, we can change how we act and respond. With God's help, we can become our best selves. And with God's help, the changes in you will bring out the best in others.

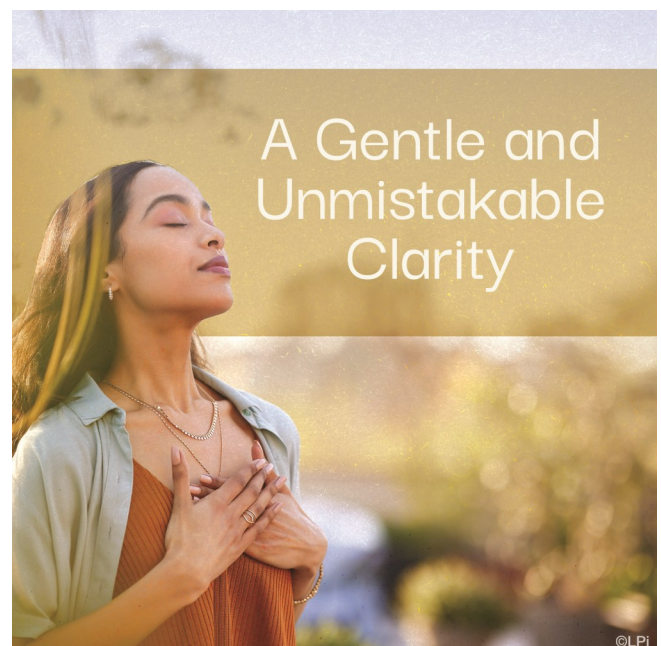
FAMILY RESPONSE:

Your challenge this week is to listen to Jesus' call to you. What is he asking you to do this week, particularly for those who are in need of healing. Just as Jesus cured those who were sick as he proclaimed the Kingdom of God, how can you help to heal someone who has an injured heart or soul? How can you bring them Jesus' message of God's boundless love and desire that all people live in dignity and hope?



PASTORAL CARE FOR THE HOMEBOUND

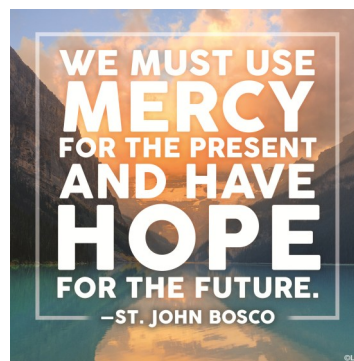

CARE FOR CREATION TIPS

"As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew, his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.' Immediately they left their nets and followed him." — Matthew 4:18-20

Jesus spent a lot of time in boats, on beaches, and along shorelines, and he spent a lot of time with people who made their livelihoods from fishing. If you've ever been to shores in the Holy Land where Jesus once walked or imagined them in your own prayer, you probably don't envision them littered with all the trash that is so common on our beaches now. Imagine how distressed Jesus would be to walk along a shoreline cluttered with plastic straws, bottles, cans, pieces of styrofoam, old tires, etc. Make time to go to a beach or shoreline near you and pick up trash. If you don't live near a body of water, do the same in your neighborhood. Better yet, go with a friend or family member, or take some kids with you to multiply the effect.

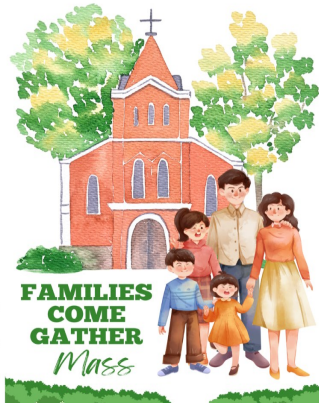

Australian Catholic Historical Society | 60th Anniversary of Vatican II Dei Verbum

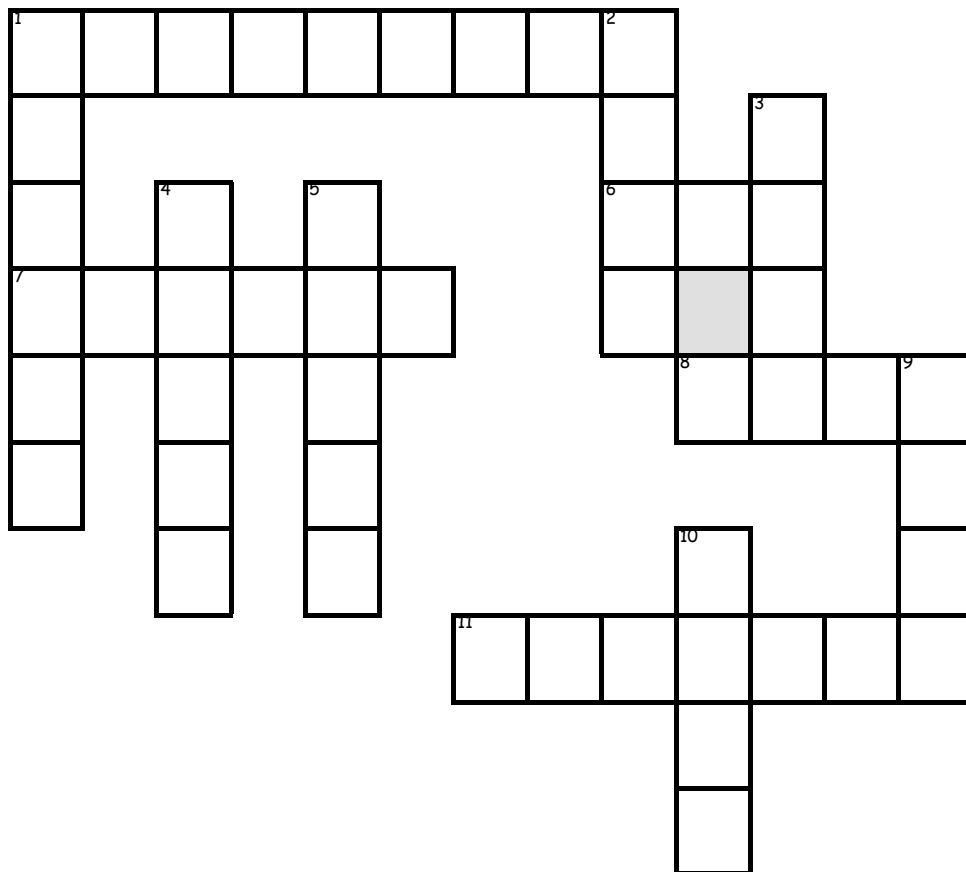


The next event for the Australian Catholic Historical Society will be held in the crypt of Saint Patrick's, Church Hill at 2:00 PM on Sunday 15 February.

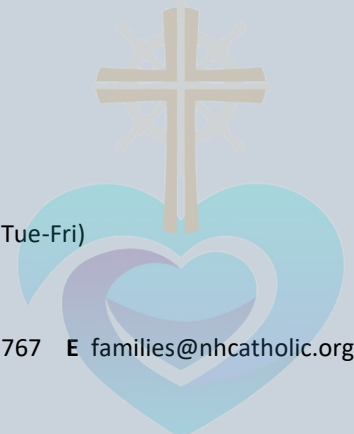

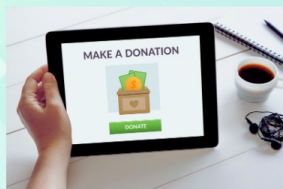
