

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

I have a friend who receives communion, but who I know for a fact is in a state of mortal sin. Should I tell our priest? Is it my responsibility to say something?

Answer:

While we may always want to do what is best for our friends and family members, we have a responsibility to respect their privacy and their conscience. In its reflections on the Eighth Commandment ("You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour"), the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury. [One] becomes guilt: -of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbour; -of detraction who, without objectively valid reason, discloses another's faults and failings to persons who do not know them; of calumny who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments concerning them" (no. 2477).

We will never truly know what is in a person's mind, heart, and soul; only God knows those things. We should, of course, take our concerns to God and entrust the person about whom we are concerned to God's grace and mercy. If we have concerns about the spiritual well-being of someone with whom we are close, we should go to the person themselves and talk about our fears and concerns. Unless it is a case of abuse or endangerment (which we have a moral and even legal responsibility to report to the appropriate authorities), we ultimately do not have the freedom to share another's persons faults or sins, however good we think our intentions might be. **©LPi**

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

Jesus is listened to because he teaches with authority. The tone of his voice, his inflection, makes people take notice. Projecting that image of authority is important for parents too. I learned that lesson when my oldest son was five.

As a youngster I hated hearing my parents say, "Because I told you so." When my first child was born I resolved that I would never say those words to my children.

It took me five years to realize the importance of developing a voice and look that conveyed those words of absolute authority.

I was feeding two toddlers when my oldest came in the house, accidentally bringing in a huge wasp. Big flying bugs scare me silly, but I knew I could not show panic. I would take care of the wasp—after my children were safely away. I asked Roger Andy to take his brother and sister out of the room. Instead of moving toward them, he sat down and asked me, "Why?" My quick explanation was met with another, "Why?" By the third "Why?", I met his eye, gave him the look, and in a monotone two octaves lower than normal, commanded: "Because I told you so." He grabbed his two siblings and left.

Later, I thanked him for rescuing Kristin and James. I would like to say I proceeded to answer all his questions about wasps, but I didn't (I was never the perfect mom). But I did learn an important lesson that day. There are certain times when a parent needs to speak with attentiongetting authority. Make sure one of those times is when you are talking

about the gospel—delivered in your everyday voice and without "the look."

FAMILY RESPONSE:

Discuss the different people of authority in your lives. Help your children understand that even adults have people who have power over them.

PERSONAL RESPONSE:

How do you respond to authority? Are you careful in how you use your authority over your children?

WEEKLY SOCIAL JUSTICE CHALLENGES

Very early on in his public career people were spellbound by Jesus' teachings and recognized that there was something unusually powerful about what he was teaching and how he was teaching. The listeners in

the synagogue in Capernaum noticed that Jesus was using his power and authority only for good, in this case, to cast out a demon. They noted the contrast with the way the scribes taught and threw around their authority. This week, think about who in your life wields authority and/or speaks persuasively and moves people to action. Now, consider, are those charismatic people using their power for good, or are they using harmful or hateful words or moving people to do harm to others? Identify those voices in your life whom you trust are speaking with the love, compassion, and mercy of Jesus, and listen to them


God, you are much stronger than evil. Nothing is too hard for you to clean.
