He opens a brand new door.

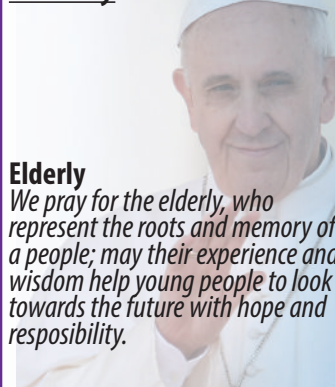

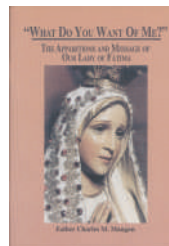

# BLESSED FRANCIS MARY OF THE CROSS JORDAN, PRIEST AND FOUNDER

*Feast Day 21st of July*



*John Baptist Jordan was born on 16 June 1848 in Gurtweil, archdiocese of Freiburg (Germany) into a poor family. After ordination to the priesthood on 21 July 1878, he was sent to Rome, where he spent most part of his life. Motivated by apostolic zeal and a desire to make known and loved the only true God, revealed in Jesus Christ, Saviour of the world, Father Jordan founded the Apostolic Teaching Society in 1881 in Rome. In 1883 he changed his apostolic work in a religious institute and took the name of Francis Mary of the Cross. From the Apostolic Teaching Society were developed the Society of the Divine Saviour and the Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Saviour. He died on 8 September 1918 in Tifers (Switzerland).*

## **Trust in Divine Providence**

Those who trust only in their own powers will accomplish nothing great for the glory of God. We must trust in divine providence, as an infant does its nurse, we must trust in the Lord in all things. The one who has trust will not fall, and the one who puts all his trust in the Lord will have the Lord on his side. How many times you have heard and read in the scriptures of what is promised to those who have hope. They have hoped in Me, they have hoped in the Lord, they will not be confounded. "In you, O Lord, have I hoped, I will not be put to shame." "Because he hoped in me, I will set him free: I will protect him because he has known my name." But surely we must not tempt God. Act in accordance with your hopes in the Lord. If you do not do what you should do, if you neglect to do what you should, you cannot have hope; if you offend God, how can you have hope in him? We must do what we ought to do and let us hope in the Lord! So, let us not trust in ourselves, not have trust or hope in princes, but hope in the Lord! He will help us. He himself will protect us! Have hope even in difficulties and in problems; if you are bereft of human resources, put all your hope in the Lord. You must toil and work and hope in the Lord. He will help us and free us. But do not trust, have no trust in your own strength, in your own abilities. So, let us be men of

faith, of trust, if we want to accomplish great things. It is essential to have faith and very great hope. Trust in the Lord. Trust in Providence: "Who has ever trusted in God and been confounded?" Don't trust in yourself or in human aid. Don't trust in princes or influential people. Trust in God! But how can you have great trust in God? If in your work you want to have great trust in God, then above all do your duty! How can you have great trust in God if you don't fulfill the duties of your vocation? How can you hope if you don't live in accordance with your position and instead jump into big projects following your own will? How can you have trust in the Lord there? So, do your duty and cast all your worries on the Lord. He will help you and rescue you! If you do your duty, then fear neither the waves that may crash over you, nor prosecutions on all sides, come what may! Trust in the Lord and go forward. Do your duty and you will see that the Lord will help you. It is unworthy for an apostolic religious and confrere of our Society not to walk the straight path! Let us trust in the Lord and do our duty. Walk in the Lord and he will protect us!

## Parish Bulletin – Term 3, Week 1

Monday was a Student Free Day at the College for the Years 8, 9 and 10 Parent/Teacher Interviews. These interviews gave parents the opportunity to discuss their child's progress with teachers and implement plans, if necessary, to enable their child to achieve their personal best.

Our Year 11 Drama students were warmly received on Wednesday and Friday as they went on tour to perform their annual Anti-Bullying Play, *The Power of Some*, to local catholic primary schools to expose the issue of bullying to students in Years 4, 5 and 6.

Our Year 12 students attended a study skills seminar to provide students with a clear road map for the final few months of their school year with practical strategies to manage the stress and pressure. Topics included goal setting, maintaining productivity, stress management and mindfulness and tips to help students cross the finish line.

Our first College Assembly for Term 3 was held this week. It was wonderful to gather as a community and celebrate the contributions and achievements of the students.

We held our Year 10 Careers Day. Parents and carers spoke about their own careers and industries, and we had several external exhibitors from tertiary institutions and other educational and career providers offering advice about the diverse range of industries and career options available. It was wonderful to see so many students excited about their future and planning the final stage of their journey at Mater Maria. This was followed by the Year 11 2023 Subject Information Evening to ensure that all students and parents have the correct information and understanding for making subject choice decisions for their HSC studies.

Year 11 VET students attended Fox Studios, Moore Park to see the Live Taping of the Masked Singer Grand Final.

On Thursday we welcomed Year 3 students from the Peninsula Learning Community of Catholic Schools to join for a day of educational activities offered by Mater Maria Catholic College staff and to celebrate our Catholic systemic school community. Our Year 10 and Year 11 students assisted with activities. Everyone enjoyed their time at Mater Maria and we hope to see many students return in the coming years.

*Lord, do not be angry if I speak.*

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.'

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.'

Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?' 'No,' he replied 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five just men there.' Again Abraham said to him, 'Perhaps there will only be forty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'for the sake of the forty.'

He said to them, 'Say this when you pray: "Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test."' He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants. "So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For

the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. **REFLECTION**  
*by Dianne Bergant CSA*

*The readings invite us to reflect on prayer. Whether our prayer be praise, contrition, thanksgiving or petition, it always recognises our need for God. In the gospel Jesus instructs us to ask for what we need. He assures us that God is more than willing to give us what we need. However, for this to happen we must turn to God and humbly acknowledge our need. The most obvious characteristic of prayer depicted in the readings for this Sunday is persistence. Neither Abraham nor the man in the gospel was deterred by any obstacle. They show that it is not so much that we persist in prayer in order to change God's mind as it is that we persist in order to discover what God's mind might be.*

*The salutariness of prayer is often found in the change that it effects in us, not in God. By persevering in genuine prayer we may come to acknowledge that all things are in God's hands, and that we can rest content to leave them there, trusting that the situation will be cared for as God sees fit. It seems trite to say that God hears all prayer and sometimes the answer is 'No!' It is better to say that God respects the freedom of people and will seldom intervene to change the way events unfold. Still, prayer can change the one who prays and also the one for whom the prayer is offered if only human need is recognised and divine solicitude is acknowledged.*
