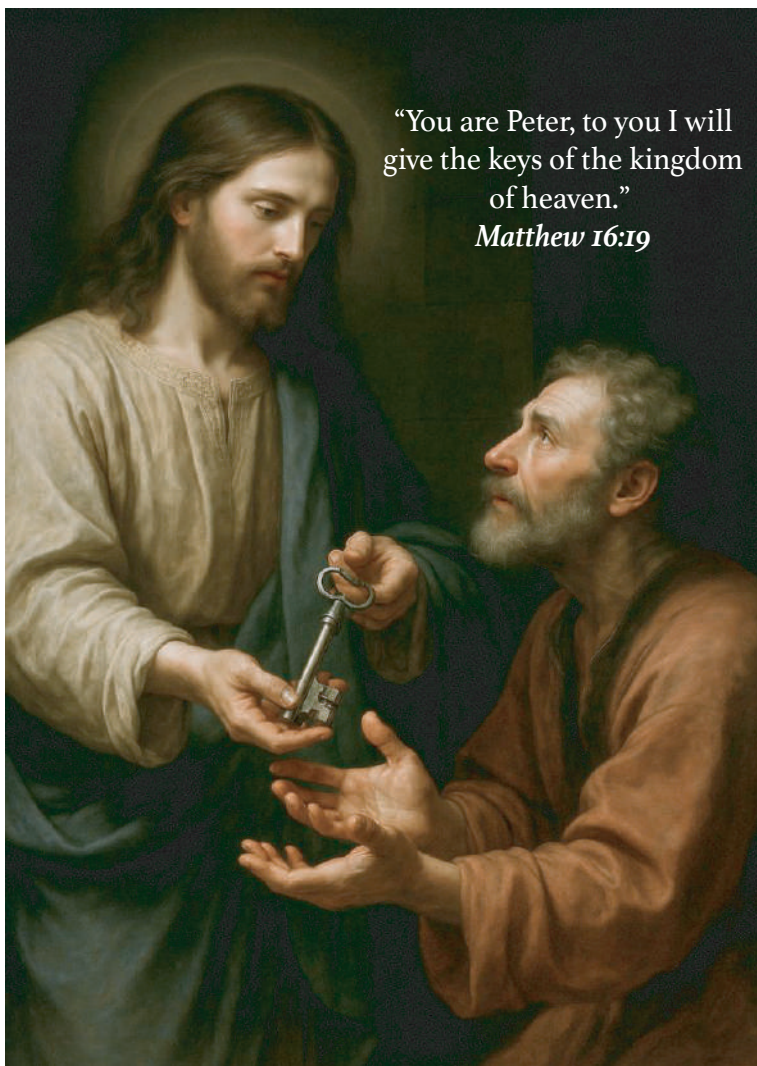

womb, Jesus.

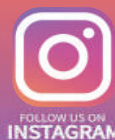

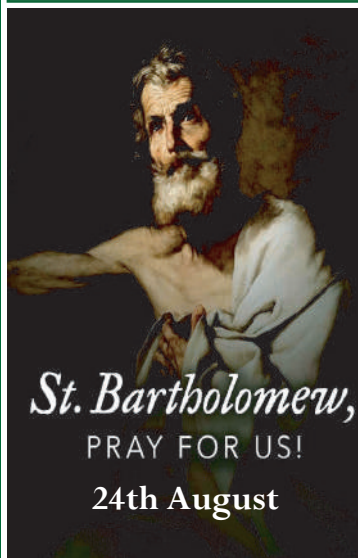

Students across Years 11 and 12 have engaged in a range of enriching leadership, faith and pathways experiences this week. Two Year 11 students served as adjudicators at the CSBB Primary School Public Speaking Competition hosted by our feeder school, St Rose Catholic Primary School. As part of National Science Week, Year 11 Physics students attended Quantum Future Talent: From Curiosity to Career at The Concourse in Chatswood, exploring the emerging field of quantum technology and related career opportunities. Year 11 Study of Catholic Thought students attended Mass at Sacred Heart Church, Mona Vale, experiencing the life of the local parish community, while Year 12 students participated in a UAC information session in the Byrne Theatre to learn more about university admission pathways.

Our Parents in Partnership (PiP) meeting was held this week. Meeting once each term, PiP provides parents and carers with an opportunity to connect with school leadership, stay informed and contribute to discussions that help strengthen our school community.

Meanwhile, our after-school Drama Program continues to grow in popularity, with many new students joining and participating in competitions. We also congratulate our MMCC Dance students who achieved Highly Commended awards in both the Jazz and Lyrical sections at The Ultimate Dance Challenge held last weekend at Moore Park.

Each Friday, our student leaders host Faith Fridays, providing opportunities for prayer, reflection, music and community in the Chapel and Courtyard.

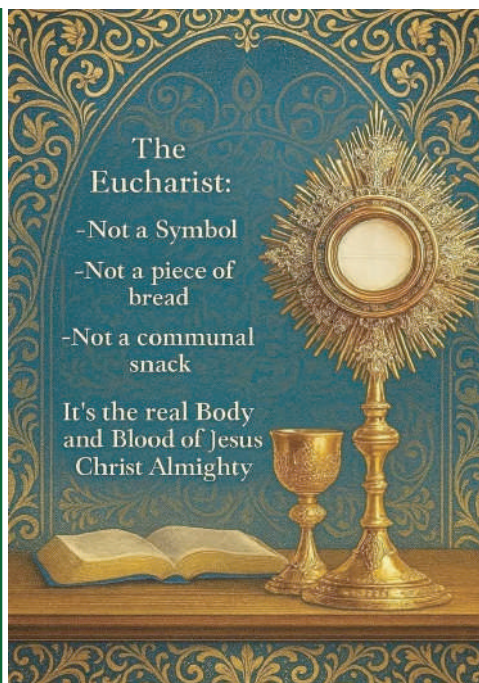
Mater students continue to embrace a wide range of co-curricular opportunities, including the MWBA Basketball Program, Peninsula Cup Soccer and Rugby Competitions, the NSWCCC Netball Championships in Penrith, the Manly Schools Cup Netball Competition at Curl Curl, the NSWCCC Open Boys Soccer Knockout Competition and the Broken Bay Junior Rugby League competition. Participation in these activities fosters teamwork, resilience, sportsmanship and school spirit while enriching the overall student experience.

MARY IS QUEEN OF HEAVEN

Mary is called the Queen of Heaven not because she is a goddess, equal to God, or worthy of divine worship. She is queen because Jesus is the eternal King, and in the biblical Davidic kingdom, the mother of the reigning king held the honored office of queen mother.



The Biblical Pattern: Queen Mother

In the Davidic kingdom, the king's mother held the office of queen mother.



1 KINGS 2:19

'So Bathsheba went to King Solomon... The king rose to meet her and bowed down to her... Then he had a throne brought for the king's mother, and she sat on his right.'

The King and Queen Mother

Jeremiah addresses the king and queen mother together.

JEREMIAH 13:18

'Say to the king and the queen mother: "Take a lowly seat, for your beautiful crown has come down from your head."



Other Examples of Queen Mothers in Scripture

- Maacah, mother or grandmother of Asa, was removed from her position as queen mother because of idolatry. (1 Kgs 15:13)
- Nehushta, mother of King Jehoiachin, was taken into exile alongside the king and royal officials. (2 Kgs 24:8, 12, 15)
- Athaliah, mother of King Ahaziah, seized royal power after her son's death. (2 Kgs 11:1-3)

Jesus is the Eternal Davidic King

Jesus is not merely one king among many. He is the promised Son of David whose kingdom will never end.

LUKE 1:32-33

"The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever."



Revelation 12: The Woman Clothed with the Sun

REVELATION 12:1

"A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and on her head a crown of twelve stars."

REVELATION 12:5

"She gave birth to a son, a male child, who is to rule all the nations with a rod of iron."

Addressing the Objection

Some object that Jeremiah condemns worship of a pagan figure called the "queen of heaven." That objection confuses two completely different things.

- ✗ Jeremiah condemns offering sacrifice to a false goddess.
- ✓ Catholics do not believe Mary is a goddess and do not offer her the worship owed to God alone.

The fact that pagans misused a title does not mean the title itself can never be used properly. Pagan rulers were called kings, yet Scripture still calls Jesus the King of kings.

Mary is Queen of Heaven because:

- ☉ Jesus is the King of Heaven.
- 👑 Jesus is the promised Davidic King.
- 👑 In the Davidic kingdom, the king's mother was the queen mother.
- 👑 Mary is the mother of Jesus, the eternal King.
- ☼ Revelation 12 depicts the mother of the Messiah in heaven wearing a crown.
- 💖 Mary's queenship glorifies Christ rather than diminishing Him.

Mary possesses nothing independently of God. Every honor given to her ultimately points back to the identity and authority of her Son.

She is queen because
Christ is King.

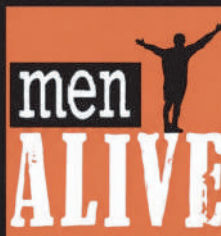

Caesarea Philippi he put this question to
his disciples, 'Who do people say the
Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some
say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah,
and others Jeremiah or one of the
prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you
say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up,
'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of
the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon
son of Jonah, you are a happy man!
Because it was not flesh and blood that
revealed this to you but my Father in
heaven. So I now say to you: You are
Peter and on this rock I will build my
Church. And the gates of the underworld
can never hold out against it. I will give
you the keys of the kingdom of heaven:
whatever you bind on earth shall be
considered bound in heaven; whatever
you loose on earth shall be considered
loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the
disciples strict orders not to tell anyone
that he was the Christ.

REFLECTION

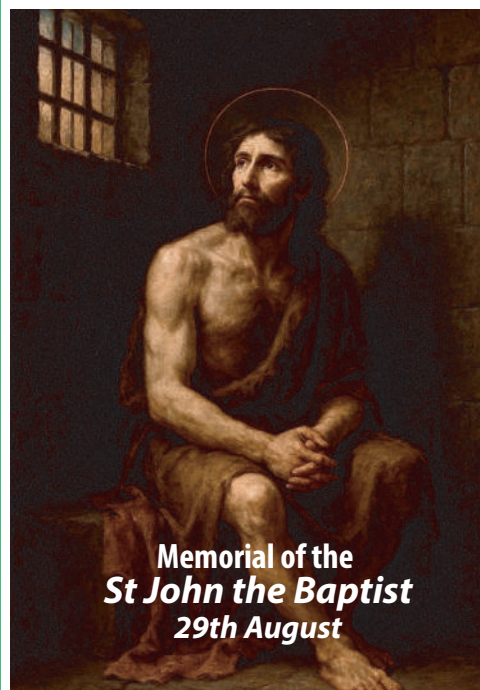

*The readings highlight two different but
related themes: the character of our
understanding of Christ, and our
understanding of discipleship that flows
from it. Christological reflections reach a
climax in the question posed to the
disciples: Who do you say I am? In this
liturgical context, the same question is
posed to us. Who is this one who
multiplies loaves of bread, who walks on
turbulent waters, who breaks the
boundaries that separate insider from
outsider? It is none other than the
messiah. When Peter testified to Jesus' identity, it
was a relevant religious and political
statement, for messianic expectation was
a burning question at that time. But what
does it mean for the average Christian
today? Many believers consider
messianic expectation a theological
theme that belongs to the past. They feel*

*that it is difficult to get excited about the
coming of someone who we believe has
already come and gone. If Jesus were to
pose this question today, how would we
answer?*

*Like Peter, we too may have good
intentions, but when they are put to the
test we realise that that was all that they
were – good intentions. Still, we should
not be discouraged by our weaknesses,
for just as Peter's failure did not deter
God from entrusting him with power and
authority, so our failures need not be
obstacles to God's grace in our lives. We
watch God entrust the church to
individuals who are weak and
undependable, and we realise that
judgments are inscrutable and God's
ways unsearchable.*
