We pray with grateful hearts, through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

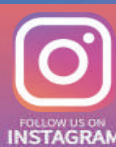

It's been a vibrant and meaningful week at Mater Maria Catholic College as our students continue to learn, grow and prepare for important milestones.

We invite our parish community to keep our Year 11 students in your prayers as they complete their Preliminary Examinations over the coming fortnight and prepare to begin their HSC studies next term. We also ask for your continued prayers for our Year 12 students as they enjoy their final days at the College and prepare for their HSC examinations. Preparations are well underway for several significant celebrations, including the Graduation and Awards Assembly, Graduation Mass and Valedictory Dinner. Our Year 12 students are deeply grateful for the faith-filled community they have experienced at Mater Maria and are looking forward to these special occasions next week.

Our Year 10 History students participated in the Voices of Survival Holocaust Education Program this week. Through survivor testimonies, historical sources and personal stories, students developed a deeper understanding of the impact of the Holocaust while reflecting on the importance of human dignity, resilience, justice and ethical responsibility.

Year 10 students also attended the P.A.R.T.Y. (Prevent Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth) Program at Royal North Shore Hospital. Through powerful presentations and interactive sessions led by police, paramedics, doctors, nurses and other health professionals, students gained valuable insights into the consequences of risk-taking behaviours and the importance of making safe and responsible choices.

Students from our Mater Maria Dance Troupe enjoyed the opportunity to participate in the Australian Dance Festival workshop at Sydney Olympic Park, where they refined their skills, explored new styles and connected with fellow young dancers from across New South Wales.

Faith Fridays continue to be a cherished part of life at Mater Maria, providing students with a welcoming and peaceful space to gather in our Chapel for prayer, reflection and connection. These weekly youth group gatherings remain a wonderful reminder of the central place of faith within our College community.

Sport has been in full swing as we near the end of Term 3, with students representing the College across a wide range of competitions and events. Highlights included the NSWCCC Athletics Carnival, Broken Bay Girls Basketball Gala Day, netball umpiring at the Catholic Primary Schools Gala Day, Rugby League competitions in the Jamie Lyon and Steve Menzies Cup, Peninsula Cup Rugby, and a Touch Football game against Barrenjoey High School. We congratulate all students involved for the enthusiasm, teamwork and sportsmanship they continue to display both on and off the field. Enrolment applications are now open for Year 7 2030. Families are reminded that Year 7 2027 and 2028 are currently at capacity, with waitlists in place and Round 2 enrolment interviews for Year 7, 2029 are now taking place. 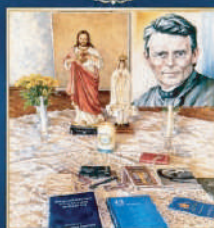
He will be remembered fondly by the parishioners here in Mona Vale and Avalon.

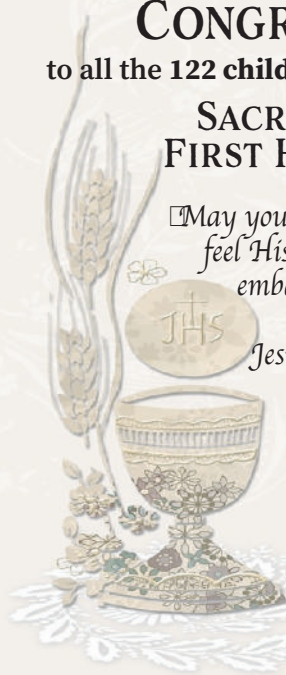

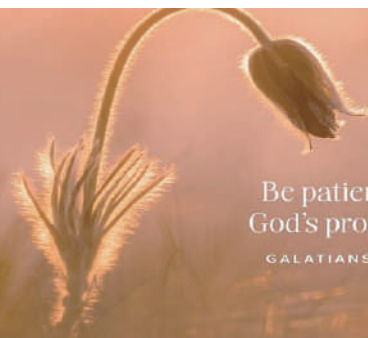

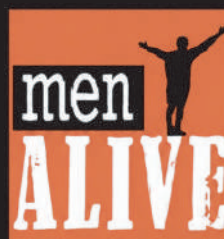

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Why are you jealous because I am generous?

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'

REFLECTION

Our attention shifts slightly in these last Sundays of Ordinary Time. We turn from concentration on the character and responsibilities of discipleship to

reflection on the import of the end of time. As we move toward the close of the liturgical year, we are invited to consider the final coming of Christ and the last judgment.

The thought of judgment is enough to strike fear in the hearts of many. We sometimes experience tension between the idea of divine justice, which requires that the good be adequately rewarded and the evil be appropriately punished, and that of the mercy of God, which we hope will be generously extended to us. As seen in the readings for this Sunday, the justice of God does not conform to the standards of human justice. It is incomprehensible, because its foundation is mercy. While we might find consolation in this view of divine judgment when it is directed toward us, our hearts do not always seem to be generous enough to rejoice in the mercy extended to others. It is almost as if we feel that we have been cheated in some way, if God is merciful to others. However, divine mercy can work in us to abolish our pettiness and indignation and replace it with generosity of heart. We are called to conduct ourselves with this kind of generosity, this kind of love, this kind of mercy.
