There is no need to book for the weekday

The bookings are now open. Further weekend Masses will be added each week, taking into consideration any changes in government restrictions.

Here are some pointers that might help:

- 1. Once you have selected the Mass you would like to book for, you will need to enter the quantity of tickets at the bottom of the page. Then click NEXT.
- 2. Once you have read and agreed to the "Additional Information" you will need to select "YES" from the dropdown box that says "I Agree to the Terms Above"
- 3. You will then need to enter the First Name and the Last Name of each of the Attendees. Then click
- 4. In the Checkout, you will need to complete all the fields, First Name, Last Name, Phone Number, Address, Suburb, Postcode and Email Address. Then click PURCHASE.
- 5. If you have completed the transaction successfully, you will see "Transaction Successful" on the following page and you will receive an email with the "ticket" to the Mass you have selected.
- 6. If you do not see "Transaction Successful" and you do not receive an email (please remember to check your junk email) then the items may still be in your cart and you may need to re-complete one of the steps.
- 7. You do not need to print the ticket. We will have your name on the "Ticket Holder List" for each Mass.

Our Year 12 Graduation Ceremony 2020 has taken place this week. Due to the unusual circumstances of COVID-19, we were unable to hold a full school assembly. Instead we livestreamed the event for our Year 12 parents, students and teachers. Our Student Reps pre-recorded their tear-jerking farewells for the Year 12 cohort to hear. The ceremony was followed up with a pizza lunch and beautifully thought out "Survival packs" as gifts to help our Year 12's get through their upcoming HSC examinations. A video will be published to all our Year 12 parents that were unable to watch the ceremony live. Our new buildings were blessed this week by Bishop Anthony Randazzo, Diocese of Broken Bay. We were disappointed that we could only invite the Bishop, Father's Bronek Pietrusewicz SDS, Richard Sadowski SDS and Robert Borg plus a few key other representatives from the Diocese due to the COVID-19 restrictions, but we arranged for the event to be filmed and this will become available over the coming days. Unfortunately, the Senior Retreat for our Year 12's which was scheduled for week 10 cannot take place, again due to COVID-19 restrictions, so we have taken the opportunity to re-schedule their preliminary exams for a week later. This will allow our students to enjoy the benefit of an additional week of study time and face-to-face teaching and learning prior to their examinations. Fr Karol Kulczycki SDS, Bishop-Elect of Port Pirie, will be ordained in Poland on 29 September before taking up his ministry in the regional South Australian Diocese



On Saturday 1st August, Pope Francis appointed Fr Karol Kulczycki SDS, the former head of the Salvatorians in Australia, as the new bishop of the Diocese of Port Pirie in regional South Australia.

Fr Kulczycki was born in Poland in 1966, ordained to the priesthood in Trzebinia in 1994 and is currently based in Poland. He spent 21 years serving the Church in Western Australia, including in parish ministry, as vocations director and as a college chaplain.

In February 2018, while still serving in Australia, Fr Kulczycki SDS was elected vice-provincial of the Polish province of the Society of the Divine Saviour — widely known as the Salvatorians. Two-and-a-half years on, Pope Francis has appointed him Bishop of Port Pirie.

"Just a few weeks ago I had an interview for our Salvatorian newsletter and was asked how and where I see myself in 10 or 20 years. I replied that I would be where God sent me. I did not expect that God would act so quickly in my life," Fr Kulczycki said.

"God is working in mysterious ways in my life. Firstly, calling me unexpectedly to religious and priestly life; secondly, directing my heart to serve him in Australia and now serving him and his people in Port Pirie Diocese."

Fr Kulczycki will become the 12th Bishop of Port Pirie — including the bishops who led what was from 1887 until 1951 the Diocese of Port Augusta.

Fr Kulczycki's episcopal ordination will take place on September 29, the Feast of the Archangels, in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Trzebinia — the church in which he was ordained a priest in 1994.

Archbishop Adolfo Tito Yllana, Apostolic Nuncio to Australia, will be the principal celebrant, assisted by the Archbishop of Krakow and the Auxiliary Bishop of Wroclaw.

The ordination Mass, which will be celebrated in English, will be livestreamed through www.sdsau.com/bishop at 7pm Australian Eastern Standard Time on Tuesday 29 September.

Fr Kulczycki, who became an Australian citizen during his 21 years of ministry in the Perth Archdiocese and Geraldton Diocese between 1997 and 2018, is expected to travel to Australia in early October before serving two weeks in quarantine.

He will be installed as the 12th Bishop of Port Pirie on October 28. The celebration will have limited attendees due to COVID-19 restrictions, but bishops from the Adelaide Province, which includes the Northern Territory, will be present.

Port Pirie Bishop Greg O'Kelly SJ said the people of the diocese are looking forward to welcoming their new shepherd.

"Bishop-Elect Karol will arrive at an unusual time in the history of our diocese, our country and our world, but we plan to ensure he receives a welcome befitting the new ministry he is undertaking," he said.

Traditionally the Bishop's crest includes the hat with its three rows of tassels hanging down either side — the number of rows indicate his rank as does the colour — green.

The central shield painted in blue is filled with the constellation of the Southern Cross as a symbol of Australia. Above these is the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove. The left and right side at the top of the shield is occupied by two letters:

S – standing for the SAVIOUR and M -standing for the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The symbolical letter "S" shows the bishop's religious upbringing in the Society of the Divine Saviour which proclaims Jesus Christ as the only Saviour of the world. In the episcopal ministry in the Diocese of Port Pirie, this mission will continue in the light of the first words of Saint Mark's Gospel, who is the patron saint of the cathedral, by proclaiming the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

In the letter "M" he entrusts himself, and those to whom he has been called, into the motherly care of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

In this crest the bishop declares his service for Australia and asks the Holy Spirit to embrace this land with His presence and power.

Below the shield there is the bishop's motto:

"IN TE DOMINE SPERAVI" - In You, Lord, I have placed my trust.





REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA


In every life there is a struggle between obedience and disobedience, and this struggle takes various twists and turns. At times we are willing to conform to regulations set from the outside, and at times we are not. We are invited to choose in favour of the reign of God, or we are free to ignore the invitation. Those who are fundamentally righteous sometimes fall from grace, and people considered evil to the core sometimes

reform their lives. What ultimately counts are not the promises made, but the actions taken.

We are called to discipleship, and there may well be urgency in this call, but it is an invitation that is to be accepted freely. As is the case with life itself, options are placed before us all the way along the road. We are invited to choose in favour of the reign of God, or we are free to ignore the invitation. However, the invitation always remains open to us, because God's desire for our acceptance is persistent and enduring. The real choice set before us today is the imitation of

The real choice set before us today is the imitation of Christ. The specific characteristic of Christ today is his humility. Since demanding one's rights can undermine the loving quality of community, Jesus' humility is offered for our imitation. It is very clear that whichever aspect of discipleship we examine, some aspect of community is also present. To be a disciple of Jesus is to follow him humbly as a member of a believing community.





