

PRAYER TO LOVE AND SERVE


O Lord,

PREPARING OUR HEARTS FOR CONFESSION: A Journey Through the 7 Deadly Sins and Heavenly Virtues



As part of our commitment to deepening our spiritual lives and growing in holiness, we are launching a **Weekly Reflection Series** focusing on the 7 Deadly Sins and their corresponding Virtues.

Each week, we will explore one of the sins that can separate us from God, along with the virtue that counteracts it and draws us closer to Him. This journey will help us better understand ourselves, recognise areas in need of God's mercy, and prepare our hearts for a sincere and fruitful Confession or Reconciliation. This is an opportunity for all of us—individually and as a community—to reflect, grow, and be renewed in our faith

Stay tuned each week for practical insights and spiritual guidance as we seek to turn away from sin and grow in virtue.

PRIDE (1ST DEADLY SIN)

Sacred Scripture speaks of pride as one of the two primary roots of sin. Various Catholic theologians and writers have seen it as one of the greatest sins, for it gives birth to many other evil impulses. St. Thomas Aguinas and Pope St. Gregory the Great called pride "the queen of all vices." Pride is an inordinate love of one's own inflated sense of superiority, a love of one's own worth, an exaggerated assessment of one's talents, or attribution to oneself of talents that one doesn't have. It is a selfexultation that makes you think you are better than others, and, in so doing, you belittle others. It is an inordinate desire for self-esteem, which flows from a sense of self-importance and self-sufficiency. St. Robert Bellarmine tells us, "Pride is a sin because a man reckons that he more than he really is, thus, he wishes to be put ahead of others and cannot suffer one to be higher than him or equal to him."

HUMILITY (1ST VIRTUE)

Humility is the first and most important step toward a life of holiness. It is the foundation of all virtue. St Augustine said in one of his letters, "The way to Christ is first through humility, second, second through humility, third through humility." (Letters 118:22)

Humility means recognising your strengths as gifts given by God, which are meant to be used for God's purposes. It's not prideful to admit that you are good at this things. It is prideful to think that these gifts and talents make you better or more important than anyone else. It is prideful to think that these gifts come from yourself and should be used selfishly for your own interest.

Humility also means recognising your weaknesses, either areas of your life to be worked on, if it's something that can be improved or accepted as a cross if it's not. Your weaknesses are occasions to rely on God for help, but they do not make you worse or less deserving than anyone else. What makes you special is God and God's love for you.

PRIDE & HUMILITY: A REFLECTION

Pride, often called the root of all sin, elevates the self above others. It whispers that we are more important, more deserving, more right. It blinds us to our own flaws and closes us off from growth, love, and grace. Pride builds wallsbetween us and others, and between us and God. But humility breaks those walls down. Where pride demands recognition, humility seeks truth. It does not belittle the self but places it in honest perspectiveacknowledging both strengths and limitations. Humility allows us to listen, to learn, to ask for help, and to admit when we are wrong. It opens the heart to compassion, and the mind to wisdom. Humility does not destroy the self; it restores it. It is not weakness, but strength under control. In humility, we become more humanmore connected to others, more receptive to grace. Thus, humility is not just the opposite of pride; it is its healing. Where pride wounds the soul by isolating it in self-importance, humility invites communion—first with others, and ultimately with the divine.





All Saints Day Celebration


Come and join us for a fun-filled parish celebration of All Saints Day!

These examinations offer students the opportunity to demonstrate the knowledge and skills they have developed throughout their years at Mater Maria Catholic College. The *Living* Word

Entrance Antiphon

Psalm 16:6,8

To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me.

First Reading Exodus 17:8-13 **A reading from the book of Exodus**As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures – from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives

and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

REFLECTION

The readings today offer various aspects of prayer for our consideration. There is the spiritual discipline of prayer itself, which is essential to the life of the disciple: there is the communal dimension of prayer; and there is the ministerial commitment that is born of prayer. Our personal prayer must be persistent. Like Moses and the woman in the gospel reading, we must be ceaseless

in our prayer, not discouraged by difficulties that we might have to face. Regardless of how strange the first reading may appear to be, it very strongly emphasises the communal dimension of prayer. As minister of the word, Timothy is admonished to keep preaching the gospel, to keep spreading the good news, to allow the scriptures to continue to be a source of wisdom for himself and, through him, for all of the people who hear him. To have this kind of facility with Scripture requires that one enter into the deep meaning of the Scriptures and make them the basis of one's prayer. One must engage in what the monks call lectio divina, prayerful reflective reading of the scriptures. This practice, or spiritual discipline, gives us access to God and it also gives God access to us. It gives us the courage and the gentleness to teach, to refute, to correct. When our ministerial activity flows from prayer, it also flows from and strengthens right relationships with God and with the community. When this becomes a reality, the Son of Man will indeed find faith on


