To ensure that we fulfil the requirements of the 80 (Mona Vale) and 100 (Avalon) people limit, we would like you to use the Trybooking website to book for our weekend Masses.
There is no need to book for the weekday Masses.
The bookings are now open. Further weekend Masses will be added each week, taking into consideration any changes in government restrictions.

Here are some pointers that might help:

1. Once you have selected the Mass you would like to book for, you will need to enter the quantity of tickets at the bottom of the page. Then click NEXT.
2. Once you have read and agreed to the "Additional Information" you will need to select "YES" from the dropdown box that says "I Agree to the Terms Above"
3. You will then need to enter the First Name and the Last Name of each of the Attendees. Then click NEXT.
4. In the Checkout, you will need to complete all the fields, First Name, Last Name, Phone Number, Address, Suburb, Postcode and Email Address. Then click PURCHASE.
5. If you have completed the transaction successfully, you will see "Transaction Successful" on the following page and you will receive an email with the "ticket" to the Mass you have selected.
6. If you do not see "Transaction Successful" and you do not receive an email (please remember to check your junk email) then the items may still be in your cart and you may need to re-complete one of the steps.
7. You do not need to print the ticket. We will have your name on the "Ticket Holder List" for each Mass.

10th Anniversary of the Canonisation of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop

Mary MacKillop was canonised on October 17, 2010 at Saint Peter's Basilica, Rome. Pope Benedict XVI proclaimed Mary's sainthood during a Canonisation Mass, in the presence of many thousands of people and streamed live around the world.



Even before her death Mary's extraordinary life and faith were widely acknowledged throughout Australia and beyond. It was this widespread recognition which led her Josephite Congregation, the Archbishop of Sydney and the Conference of Australian Bishops to request that Mary's holiness be acclaimed by the wider Church. Mary was beatified in Sydney on January 19, 1995 by Pope John Paul II. This took place in the presence of many thousands of people who had travelled from all over Australia, New Zealand and many parts of the world. Her canonisation in Rome followed 16 years later, giving Australia its first canonised saint.

Since then people from many cultures, from different faiths and traditions, and from all walks of life have been inspired by her example of faith, service and love for all.

Mary MacKillop's tomb is venerated at the Mary MacKillop Memorial Chapel, Mount Street, North Sydney. Pilgrims visit this site daily to pray to God, through her intercession, for their needs. On the 8th day of each month many hundreds of pilgrims make their way to this shrine. Her feastday is celebrated on August 8th each year in parishes and communities all over Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, Scotland, Peru, Timor-Leste and in many other places where Mary's followers are found. She has been named patron of dioceses, parishes, charitable works and institutions across the world.

Mary's canonisation has proved to be a powerful impetus for many of the world's people in their efforts to recognise God in all of creation and especially those of the human family who are dispossessed and marginalised. Her spirit seems to act as a magnet for all who seek God.

Recognising Mary

Even at the time of her death those who knew her, or knew of her extraordinary work, spoke openly of her holiness.

Cardinal Moran, having visited her just days before she died and believing that history was being made before him, assured the Sisters that Mary's death would bring many blessings, not just to the Congregation she founded, but to the whole Australian church. He commented that he had assisted at the death bed of a saint.

The Australian press, both secular and religious, were uncommonly united in speaking of her holiness, her heroic service of God, her open hearted love for the

poor and deprived, and her determination to bring a Catholic education to the children of the colonies.

The Freeman's Journal, no less, claimed that Mary's death left an irretrievable blank in the national life of Australasia. What she had done for the glory of God and in service of the people of this land,

"would stand in years to come as the noblest record of an Australian woman."

Freeman's Journal, 19th August, 1909

Across the nation in Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide and Sydney, newspapers spoke of her seemingly relentless efforts to bring the love and knowledge of God to the length and breadth of this country, and to bring hundreds of ordinary women to join her.

Among Protestants and Catholics, Christians and Jews, Mary MacKillop was seen to be one who made her mark on the hearts and minds of the people of this land, one who touched our national character with a vision which was both uplifting and ennobling.



Mary MacKillop was a young woman with a dream to make a difference in our world. Her dream encompassed opening simple schools where there was no class distinction, offering refuge to the most neglected, and bringing practical help to families. Mary felt very strongly the widespread ignorance of the whole of the spiritual dimension of life and dedicated her life to bringing the message of God's love to all whom she encountered.

She was a passionate woman whose youthful spirit has touched the 'heart and soul' of the Australian people. She embodies all that is best in our Australian nation and its people. Her spirit and values continue to inspire young people today to make a difference in these times.

One of the appeals that 'saints' have for people in the world today, is that they are ordinary people who have looked at life and, in the day to day circumstances in which they lived, succeeded in becoming a special person who touches into the deepest yearnings of the heart. Mary MacKillop was no exception.

She was an ordinary woman who lived an extraordinary life. She was a woman who dared to love. She knew that God loved her and she responded to this love with confidence and courage.

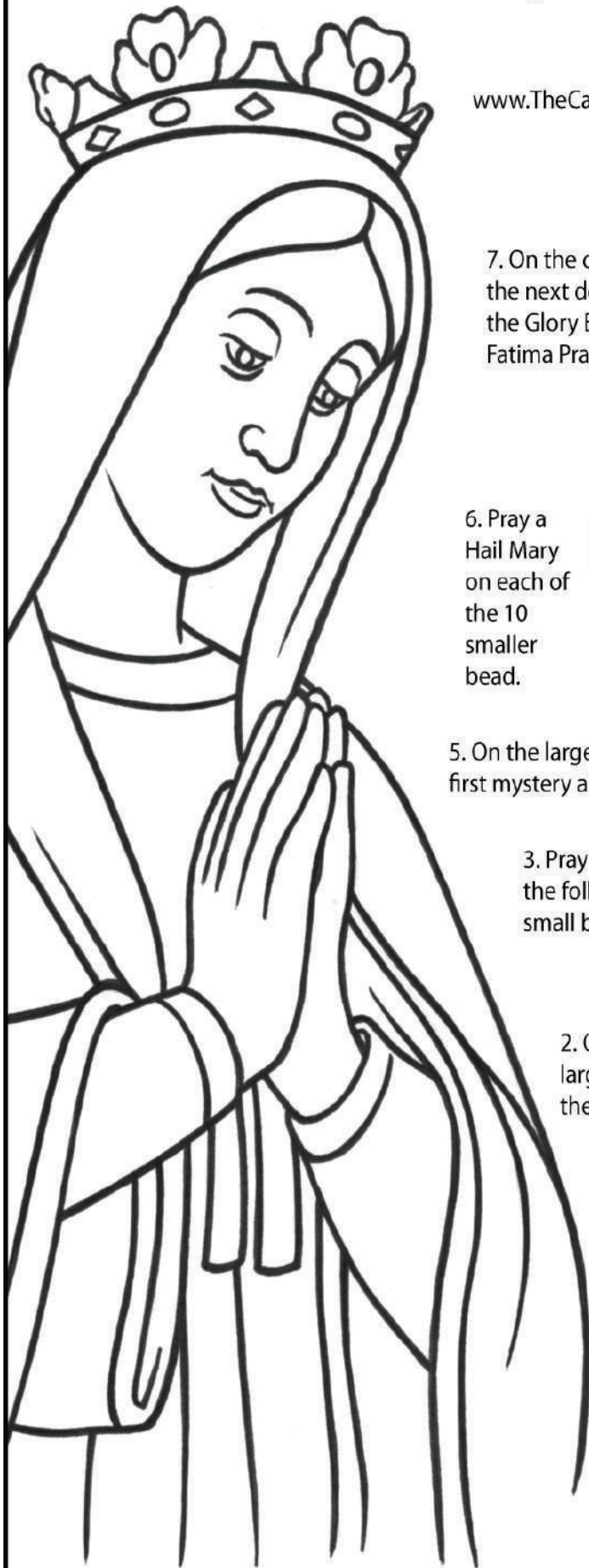

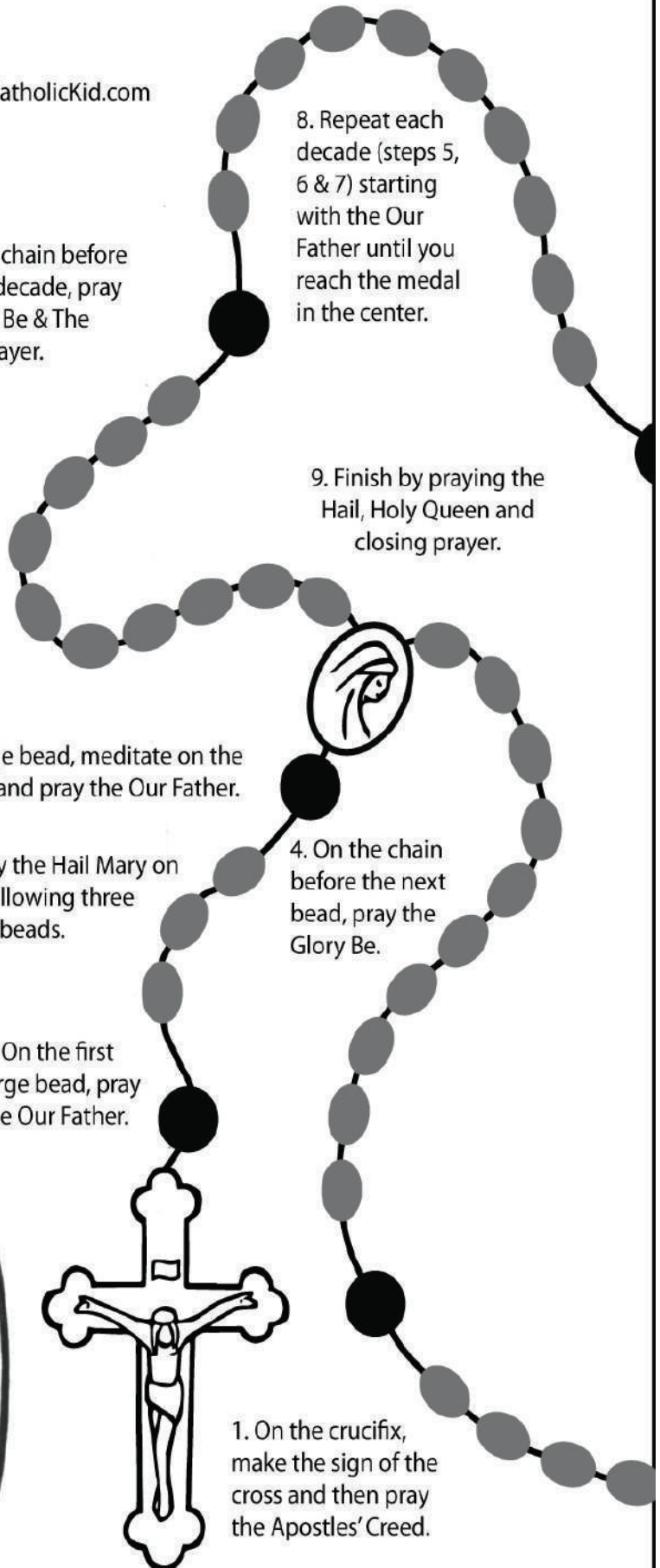

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

*The frequency with which we consider the question of insider-outsider is an indication of how important universalism and the breaking down of boundaries is within our religious tradition. All peoples, all lands are called on to praise God. Furthermore, God cares about and cares for all people (see Is 19:25), and God works through all people to accomplish good in the world: Gandhi, a Hindu of Indian origin; Martin Luther King, Jr; a Baptist minister; Susan B. Anthony, a suffragist; Nelson Mandela, a Black South African, etc. Human beings have always realised that, in comparison with the grandeur and expansiveness of the universe within which they live, they are weak and vulnerable creatures. This has led them to believe in and offer homage to a divine being, or beings. Praise of God has always been an expression of awe and gratitude as well as humility.
If neither gender, nor race, nor age, nor class nor culture qualifies one for being an insider, what does?*

Today's readings suggest that it is service of others. In breaking down the walls of prejudice, the social activists of our own age liberate not only the oppressed groups to which they belong, but also those who oppress them. The lives of these dynamic people show us that service of others draws them into our circles and encircles us in theirs. With open arms God invites all into an embrace of divine love. As God has embraced us, so we are called to embrace all others.

Church Tradition has always urged prayer for the deceased, in particular by offering the Eucharistic Celebration for them: it is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to those who are the most forsaken. The foundation of prayer in suffrage lies in the communion of the Mystical Body.
As the Second Vatican Council repeats, "fully conscious of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the pilgrim Church from the very first ages of the Christian religion has cultivated with great piety the memory of the dead" (Lumen Gentium, n. 50). Remembering the dead, caring for their graves and prayers of suffrage, are the testimony of confident hope, rooted in the certainty that death does not have the last word on human existence, for man is destined to a life without limits, which has its roots and its fulfillment in God.
