



Opportunities to grow during Lent

Sunday Mass is a time to rejoice each week as we celebrate our Eucharistic Lord in communion not only with our communities but with the worldwide church. Daily Mass is a perpetual invitation to Christ's flock to believe in and to receive him. Some parishes add extra Mass times during the week to accommodate those who usually cannot attend normal daily Mass times. It is a perfect idea to find out where you may attend a noon mass or evening if available during Lent.

Spiritual Communion Prayers

Reading the daily Mass readings each day is an excellent practice when unable to attend daily mass. The spiritual communion prayer is one that can be recited after the readings as a way of uniting oneself to Jesus. There are a variety of prayers which can be said in uniting oneself to the Lord. A simple prayer from the heart may suffice in expressing the longing of the heart. It is a way to give thanks. The spiritual communion prayer is another avenue to acknowledge and cherish Christ's Eucharistic heart.

Preparation for reception of the **Eucharist**

Preparing our hearts, our minds, and our souls to receive Jesus in the Eucharist may be one of the most overlooked aspects of all. Going to confession regularly, following the precepts of the church, and living as an authentic Catholic will help in preparation for receiving him. In addition, dressing properly for Mass in terms of modesty, cleanliness, and properness honors him. This awareness draws us closer to the lord. It is a way to love and serve him.

Lent is indeed the right time to begin the journey of loving our Lord in the greatest of ways. These practices are not just meant for Lent, they are meant to be continued. Most of all, marvel at the fact



Project Compassion Second Sunday of Lent PROJECT 4 & 5 March

Tereesa is a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concer was finding stability for her children. Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community. Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.

Parish Bulletin- Term 1 Week 5

Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) held their first ever Year 7 "Belong" Day this week with all Year 7 students from other CSBB schools. This was a diocesan Gathering at The Light of Christ Centre, Waitara where all of our Year 7 students along with their Religious Education teachers were in attendance. Students met with Bishop Anthony Randazzo, our Director of Schools Mr Danny Casey, CSBB Principals, including our own Mr Marc Reicher, along with the CSBB Evangelisation Team. The day focused on belonging to Mater Maria and to our Catholic Diocese. Over twenty of our Year 10 students, who were trained as Small Group Leaders, facilitated small group sessions for our students on the day. Mater Maria Year 11 and Year 12 students also performed musical items throughout the day, including the Broken Bay World Youth Day Lisbon '23 song, "Magnify." It was an excellent day for our new students.

Year 11 and Year 12 Musicians attended the annual Encore concert at the Sydney Opera House this week. The concert showcased a selection of outstanding performances and compositions from the 2022 HSC Music examinations and was an exciting opportunity for current music students, teachers, and the general public to see and hear a selection of exemplary works.

Year 12 students studying Advanced English had an excursion to Surry Hills to watch a performance of King Richard III, held in Eighteen80 Hall (an old Church) in Surry Hills, performed by the theatre group Sport for Jove. The annual Mater Maria Swimming Carnival was held on Thursday at the Warringah Aquatic Centre. We had a high attendance from our students, and large participation rates fuelled a day full of quality swimming and many fast times. The school spirit created by the students was amazing with all swimmers being cheered on by their Houses.



There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The blessings upon which we meditate today are undeserved gifts from God. They were not earned. The graciousness of God transforms us in such a way as to effect new beginnings. It can be seen in the promises made to Abram. He leaves the past behind and moves into a new future. It can be seen in the psalm response. The Lord delivers us from death and inspires us to look to the future. It can be seen in the reading from 2 Timothy. Through Christ Jesus we are called to a new life of holiness; we escape the fetters of death and are brought into the freedom of the resurrection. We see it in the gospel, a glimpse into the future glory of Jesus which, through grace, we will be able to share. Lent is a time of new beginnings which find their origin in the abundant blessings of God.

The ultimate blessing of God is Jesus himself. As Abram was called to be the source of blessing for all others, as Peter, James and John were chosen to witness the transfiguration of Jesus, so today we too are invited to look to Jesus for inspiration during this holy season. Paul speaks of the salvation that Jesus brings

as having come, not because of any works of righteousness that we might have performed, but because of the grace of God. Once again the Lenten readings focus on the merciful action of God in our lives, and in the end they point to Jesus.


