menAlive is a National Catholic Ministry to Men which was founded out of a response to a great need in the hearts and lives of men, and a great need in the life of the Catholic Church.


The purpose of **menAlive** is to bring men together, to renew their faith in God and to encourage them to become an active force within the Church.

Parish Bulletin Term 1, Week 3


This week we welcomed back some of our high achieving students from the HSC Class of 2023, including our DUX who received 99.35 ATAR, and congratulated them on their academic achievements. These individuals were recognised as High Achievers for 2023 at Mater Maria and have all enrolled to do various degrees at universities all over Sydney and New South Wales. We extend our congratulations and best wishes to all the Year 12s, their families and all the Mater Maria staff for achieving extraordinary results for their bright futures.

We also welcomed parents to our Parent Information Evening for students in Years 8 and 9. We focused on growth for all students and staff, how to engage with student learning, methods of communication, the importance of attendance and the ways that we are supporting student wellbeing through pastoral care. Helping each student flourish and grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ is our core business here at Mater Maria Catholic College.

Our Year 12 Visual Arts students attended a workshop at the Art Express exhibition at the Art Gallery of NSW and Museum of Contemporary Art as part of their HSC Assessment Task; Whilst Japanese students in the Cross Campus Centre Japanese Beginners and Japanese Cultural course attended an orientation excursion to Sydney CBD to visit examples of Japanese culture in the city such as Kinokuniya bookstore and Regent Place. A reading from the book of Genesis The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

This is my Son, the beloved; listen to him.

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

REFLECTION

We all have dreams for the future, dreams about success and well-being. We all want a better world for our children and grandchildren. Our religious tradition sets before us aspirations that call for personal transformation. However, sometimes when we follow the inspiration of our most devout aspirations, obstacles are thrown in our path preventing us from following our dreams. Still, God does not call us out of our dreams into a vacuum. If we are asked to relinquish a possible future, it is only to be offered God's future. Our aspirations may be noble, but the possibilities that God offers will outstrip them in excellence. Abraham was promised an heir; he relinquished his hold on his heir, and he was granted heirs beyond counting. Jesus came as a Rabbi; he allowed himself to be handed over to death, and he was revealed as the beloved Son of God.

Those preparing for Baptism might be asked to relinquish the dreams that they previously held in order to embrace the future God has in store for them. We who are already joined to Christ will be asked to recommit ourselves to this transformative experience. Do we have faith, or do we need a glimpse of Christ's transfiguration in order to believe in his resurrection? Do we have to see and touch Jesus, or are we able to believe because we have heard his message? God's future in Christ is open to us, but we must accept it in faith, even when we do not fully understand what it means.






