PREPARING OUR HEARTS FOR CONFESSION:

A Journey Through the 7 Deadly Sins and Heavenly Virtues

As part of our commitment to deepening our spiritual lives and growing in holiness, we are launching a **Weekly Reflection Series** focusing on the 7 Deadly Sins and their corresponding Virtues.

Each week, we will explore one of the sins that can separate us from God, along with the virtue that counteracts it and draws us closer to Him. This journey will help us better understand ourselves, recognise areas in need of God's mercy, and prepare our hearts for a sincere and fruitful Confession or Reconciliation. This is an opportunity for all of us—individually and as a community—to reflect, grow, and be renewed in our faith.

Stay tuned each week for practical insights and spiritual guidance as we seek to turn away from sin and grow in virtue.

GLUTTONY (2ND DEADLY SIN)

Gluttony (From Lat. gluttire, to swallow, to gulp down), the excessive indulgence in food and drink. The moral deformity discernible in this vice lies in its defiance of the order postulated by reason, which prescribes necessity as the measure of indulgence in eating and drinking. Clearly one who uses food or drink in such a way as to injure his health or impair the mental equipment needed for the discharge of his duties, is quilty of the sin of aluttony. It is incontrovertible that to eat or drink for the mere pleasure of the experience, and for that exclusively, is likewise to commit the sin of gluttony. Such a temper of soul is equivalently the direct and positive shutting out of that reference to our last end which must be found, at least implicitly, in all our actions. At the same time it must be noted that there is no obligation to formally and explicitly have before one's mind a motive which will immediately relate our actions to God.

TEMPERANCE (2ND VIRTUE)

controlling our strongest desires—those for

Temperance is mainly concerned with

the greatest pleasures. These pleasures come from our most natural actions, which are about staying alive and reproducing. So, the greatest pleasures come from eating, drinking and sex, because these are tied to survival and reproduction. These pleasures come through the sense of touch, which is why temperance is especially about touch, and only secondarily about the other senses like taste, smell, sight, and sound, which often just prepare us for pleasures of touch (like the smell of food or seeing someone attractive). The standard for temperance is reasonknowing what's right and fitting. What counts as reasonable depends on our real needs at a given time, and on what truly matters in life, such as truth, beauty, relationships, leisure, and faith. In the end, a good life is one that aims toward our highest purpose, which is to know and love God, the Supreme Good. Living a virtuous life means everything we do, especially in terms of pleasure, should be directed toward that ultimate goal.

GLUTTONY & TEMPERANCE A REFLECTION

In Catholic teaching, the struggle between gluttony and temperance is not merely about food or physical indulgence—it is a reflection of our spiritual state and our orientation toward God. These concepts are deeply rooted in the understanding that the human body is a temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19) and that the proper ordering of our desires leads us closer to holiness.

The path from gluttony to temperance is not one of guilt, but of conversion—a reorientation of our desires toward God. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we bring our disordered attachments before God and receive grace to grow in virtue.

Ultimately, temperance prepares our hearts to love more freely. When we are no longer enslaved by our appetites, we can love God and neighbour with undivided hearts.

May we pray for the grace to recognise where gluttony takes root in our lives and cultivate the virtue of temperance, trusting that God alone satisfies the deepest hungers of the soul.




PLEASE DON'T FORGET YOUR PILGRIMAGE PASSPORT

All Saints Day Celebration


Come and join us for a fun-filled parish celebration of All Saints Day!

REFLECTION

It is very easy for religious people to fall into a kind of self-righteousness. Their very enthusiasm and generosity can plant the seeds of religious arrogance. They know what commitment demands of them; they experience relative success in their endeavors to be faithful; they distance themselves from what they think might threaten their resolve; and then they pass judgment on those who do not share their values or experience their success. This kind of arrogance is often imperceptible, because there is enough

truth in every step along the way that it is difficult to recognise when one is veering off the track.

Jesus extols the humility of the one who admits being a sinner, and can accept the implications of that admission. This is the kind of prayer that is described in the reading from Sirach and the psalm response. It is those who can admit that they are needy who turn to God in that need. It is those who trust that God will be their strength in the face of their weaknesses who are strengthened. Paul's own prayer demonstrates the attitudes that should be ours as we pray. Like the Pharisee, he acknowledges his success. He has competed well; he has finished the course; he has kept the faith. However, unlike the Pharisee, he acknowledges that God is the source of any good he has been able to accomplish. The Lord stood by him and gave him strength. If there is any glory, it belongs to God. Paul's confident prayer springs from a humble heart.


