





Parish Bulletin - Term 4, Week 4

This Monday marked the start of yearly examinations for our Year 7, 8, and 9 students. Please keep those students in your thoughts and prayers as they navigate this important phase in their academic journey.

From Sunday 12 November to Tuesday 21 November, our students in Years 7, 8 and 9 who are studying Japanese, will have the fantastic opportunity to participate in the Japanese Cultural Immersion Program. We are excited to welcome several students from Hamamatsu Nittai High School in Japan, who will be staying with local families and learning English at Mater Maria Catholic College.

On Monday, Year 10 students had the privilege of attending their annual Reflection Day. This event was a significant part of our evangelization and catechetical program, focusing on the teachings found in Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si. We reflected on what these teachings mean for us as we strive to lead our lives as faithful Catholics.

Meanwhile, our Year 10 students embarked on a Faith in Action program at Jesuit Social Service in Mt. Druitt on Thursday, an area with the largest urban Aboriginal population in Australia.

Year 11 students participated in the Prevent Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth (P.A.R.T.Y) program at Royal North Shore Hospital. This interactive program aimed to raise awareness about the consequences of risky choices, giving our students a firsthand experience by interacting with police, paramedics, doctors, nurses, allied health professionals and volunteers at the hospital.

On Friday, we gathered in our College amphitheatre for our Remembrance Day Service. Together, we observed a moment of silence to reflect on the service and sacrifices made by Australians who have given their lives or suffered in the service of our nation.

Sports played a big role at the College this week. Our junior students took part in the Peninsula Cup U14 Boys Touch Football Competition, and we saw numerous basketball games being played after school hours as part of the MWBA Basketball Competition.

Book of Remembrance

Church tradition has always urged prayer for the deceased, in particular byoffering the Eucharist Celebration for them: it is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls, particularly to those who are most forsaken. The foundation of prayer in suffrage lies in the communion of the Mystical Body. As the Second Vatican Council repeats, "fully conscious of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the pilgrim Church from the very first ages the Christian religion has cultivated with great piety the "memory of the dead" Lumen Gentium, n.50) Remembering the dead, caring for their grave and prayers of suffrage, are the testimony of confident hope, rooted in the certainty that death does not have the last word on human existence, forman is destined to a life without limits, which has its roots and its fulfillment in God.

We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. will come down from heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together with them, to meet the Lord in the air. The early Christians thought that all their questions about death had been answered with the resurrection of Jesus. Therefore, when loyal Christians began to die, not only did their old questions come back, but also they were plagued with new and difficult ones. Was it possible that those loyal Christians had not been loyal after all? Or worse, were the promises made by Jesus empty promises? No! Paul assures us. It is all true. Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again, and all the faithful will be joined with him. How it will happen, we do not know. When it will happen, we do not know. That it will happen, we are sure.

The wisdom that we have culled from life becomes the treasury from which we draw the prudence and insight needed to negotiate life's paradoxes. It throws light on our strengths and on our weaknesses; it enables us to discern what is important and what is not; it directs us to bring extra oil in our lamps. Life and the wisdom that we have acquired through it, have taught us that we can indeed trust the promises of God. They have been fulfilled in the past, and wisdom assures us that they will be fulfilled in the future. It is wisdom that cautions us to be vigilant, to be ready to adjust our plans. It is wisdom that prepares us for the night watches of life. It is wisdom that instructs us to be ready at all times.



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
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
