

A Pastoral Letter from Bishop Anthony Randazzo to the community of the Church of Broken Bay During this season of Advent, a season of hope, we are confident that God is merciful. We have this confidence because in every age, God has shown His justice and His mercy. To show mercy is to treat someone like they are one of the family. God, our loving Father most certainly treats us as His own children. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, tells us that "God always waits for us, even when we have left Him behind! He is never far from us, and if we return to Him, He is ready to embrace us." During Advent, we hear the Prophets calling us to return to God and experience His mercy. We hear John the Baptist call us to repent and experience God's mercy. We anticipate the celebration of God's greatest act of mercy, the sending of His only Son, Jesus, to be with us. We encounter God's great mercy in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

Advent is a wonderful time to celebrate the reconciling love and the healing graces our Lord offers us.



We acknowledge the lifelong trauma of abuse victims, survivors and their families, the failures of the Catholic Church to protect, believe and respond justly to children and vulnerable adults, and the consequent breach of community trust. Even though the restrictions in NSW have eased and Churches can now have up to 300 people attending, the one person per two-square metre rule still applies. This means that the capacity of our Churches remains at 160for Sacred Heart Church, Mona Vale and 200 for Maria Regina Church, Avalon.

It is our responsibilty to protect others and ourselves and stop the spread of COVID-19 in Australia.

We will continue to record names and contact details of those present at services along with the date and time they attend, as required by NSW health.

Continue to practise good hygiene. Please use the hand sanitisers provided in both of our Churches.

As we move towards living COVIDSafe, it is important that you **stay at home if you feel unwell.** If you have cold or flu like symptoms, such as a fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose or shortness of breath, you should seek medical advice and get tested for COVID-19. You should get tested even if your symptoms are mild, and **do not come to Church.**

Everyone must also stay 1.5 metres away from other people whenever possible. Please sit only in the marked seats.

If you have a coughing episode in Church, we advise you to step out to the courtyard, or the parish centre, away from others for the moment.

The use of face masks is encouraged to keep our communities safe during this time.

If you have been overseas or interstate in the last 14 days, or have been in contact with a confirmed case of Covid 19 in the last 14 days, have been a hotspot vicinity, or awaiting a Covid - 19 test result, as much as we would like you to be with us here in Church, we appreciate your prayers more than your presence in this situation. There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light. This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.3 Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

Traditionally, the third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of Joy. The joy of this Sunday comes both from the message of the readings and from the anticipation that Christmas is nearing. As described in the Isaian passage, the Messiah is the one imbued with the spirit and with the power of the prophet, the one who will fulfill the promises of God. It becomes obvious in the Gospel that the Messiah is the one proclaimed by the Baptist. John cleared a path for the coming of the anointed one, and from that time on the lives of believers have been the pathway through which the Messiah has entered the world.
