O most awe-inspiring King, we bow before You and pray;



To ensure that we fulfil the requirements of the 80 (Mona Vale) and 100 (Avalon) people limit, we would like you to use the Trybooking website to book for **our weekend Masses**.

There is no need to book for the weekday Masses.

The bookings are now open. Further weekend Masses will be added each week, taking into consideration any changes in government restrictions.

Here are some pointers that might help:

- Once you have selected the Mass you would like to book for, you will need to enter the quantity of tickets at the bottom of the page. Then click NEXT.
- 2. Once you have read and agreed to the "Additional Information" you will need to select "YES" from the dropdown box that says "I Agree to the Terms Above"
- 3. You will then need to enter the First Name and the Last Name of each of the Attendees. Then click NEXT.
- In the Checkout, you will need to complete all the fields, First Name, Last Name, Phone Number, Address, Suburb, Postcode and Email Address. Then click PURCHASE.
- 5. If you have completed the transaction successfully, you will see "Transaction Successful" on the following page and you will receive an email with the "ticket" to the Mass you have selected.
- 6. If you do not see "Transaction Successful" and you do not receive an email (please remember to check your junk email) then the items may still be in your cart and you may need to re-complete one of the steps.
- 7. You do not need to print the ticket. We will have your name on the "Ticket Holder List" for each Mass.





Ask A Priest — Feast of Christ the King By Fr Josh Miechels - November 27, 2019

Why do we have a Feast of Christ the King?

Pope Pius XI decided to institute the Feast of Christ the King in 1925 for one main reason: because the world is screwed up. "The rebellion of individuals and states against the authority of Christ has produced deplorable consequences."

Like what? "the seeds of discord sown far and wide; those bitter enmities and rivalries between nations... that insatiable greed which is so often hidden under a pretence of public spirit and patriotism, and gives rise to so many private quarrels... no peace in the home, because men have forgotten or neglect their duty; the unity and stability of the family undermined."

Sound familiar? Funny how, 100 years later, we are suffering even worse from the same problems. Sometimes Popes really know what they are talking about.

Which is why perhaps we should have a second serious look at the solution Pius XI provides: Christ, truly, as King.

Is it an appropriate title?

Aren't we imposing a medieval title where a post-modern democratic one might be more appropriate? The thing is of course that it's not a medieval title: since their first days Christians have always called Christ King. Even then, it wasn't our idea: Jesus himself called himself King, and acted like one. Remember the donkey thing on Palm Sunday?

Remember his answer to Pilate? "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world." It was what he was insulted and spat for. It was the reason he wore a crown of thorns. It is the reason that walking into almost any Catholic church into the world one is confronted with a crucifix titled with a whopping big sign saying "INRI" — "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews".



Pope Pius reminds us that Jesus is king in a number of ways:

King because he is perfection itself.

King because he reigns in the hearts of men because he is perfectly intelligent, he knows everything, and he is Truth itself.

King in the wills of men, because in him "the human will was perfectly and entirely obedient to the Holy Will of God"

But the Pope is at pains to point out that he is also king as a man, having received from the Father "supreme and absolute dominion over all things created." He gave and made laws; he made judgements about them; and he carries out those laws — legislative, judicial and executive power. It's true Christ's kingdom is not of this world: we enter it by "faith and baptism". Yet "it would be a grave error...to say that Christ has no authority whatever in civil affairs, since...all things are in his power."

It is in this way Pope Pius argues that welcoming Christ as King will bring peace to the world. He

says that if those in government do so, they will understand their authority is not one with which they can legislate or impose whatever they want, but rather a service and sacred trust which can only be authentically exercised as a service to human freedom and dignity, and that if citizens (that is, any member of society) allow Christ to rule, we can more easily obey whomever — on our work, family, or civic life — has been set over us, as when lived properly we are not simply obeying other people, but rather Christ himself who rules us through them — as Jesus humbly did in his Passion.

ADORE - An Advent Reflection

In the day-to-day reality of our lives, especially during the busyness of end-of-year activities, it is easy for us to lose sight of what we are truly preparing for during Advent and celebrating at Christmas—the Incarnation. The magnitude of this event was not lost on the shepherds and the Magi who came to adore the Child who is truly Emmanuel: God-with-us.

As Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI) wrote in God Is Near Us: The Eucharist, The Heart Of Life: "Without adoration, there can be no transformation of the world." The life of the creature must be one of adoration. This life of adoration was also not lost on our Blessed Mother who cried out in her Magnificat: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my saviour. . . . The almighty works marvels for me. Holy is his name" (Lk 1:46–49).

Inspired by the shepherds, Magi and our Blessed Mother, this year's reflection book, Adore, provides a wonderful opportunity for us to take a quiet step out of our daily lives and refocus our attention on the Lord in adoration of what he has done for us through his Son.

Adore is an 88-page pocket-size book containing short spiritually rich, yet accessible, daily reflections from the beginning of Advent (29 November 2020) through to the Baptism of the Lord (10 January 2021).

Adore also features beautiful religious artworks from the Masters such as Ghirlandaio, Poussin, Champaigne, Botticelli, Le Brun, Fra Angelico and Rubens with enlightening "Artwork Spotlight" reflections written by the popular Monsignor Graham Schmitzer.

We acknowledge the lifelong trauma of abuse victims, survivors and their families, the failures of the Catholic Church to protect, believe and respond justly to children and vulnerable adults, and the consequent breach of community trust.

Even though the restrictions in NSW have eased and Churches can now have up to 300 people attending, the one person per four-square metre rule still applies. This means that the capacity of our Churches remains at 80 for Sacred Heart Church, Mona Vale and 100 for Maria Regina Church, Avalon.





REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

We have now come to the end of the liturgical year, the point that marks the transition from one period to another. Today we see that the kingdom of God is inclusive. Its embrace is as comprehensive as is the embrace of God. Criteria for membership are not based on obedience to the commandments or on conformity to ritual obligation, but on the bonds of love and concern.

What we do for others, we do for Christ, because Christ is identified with those in need. We very seldom see the face of the glorified Christ in the faces of the needy; it is more often the face of the disfigured Christ that is turned to us. We see his fear and his shame, his brokenness and sense of loss. As difficult as it may be to look into such eyes, it is precisely the needy with whom Christ is identified.

Having entered into the frailty of human nature, identified himself with the needy, and handed himself over to death, in the end Christ will have conquered all. It is a curious kingdom that he has won, a kingdom of the weak rather than the strong. He has turned the standards of the world upside down. He has shown that it does not take strength to ignore or to exploit the needy, but it does take strength to overcome our own selfishness in order to serve them. The kingdom that Christ hands over to God is a kingdom of love and care.


