



Parish Bulletin Term 4, Week 7

Over the past week, our Year 8 Japanese students paired up with Year 9 students from a Shizuoka High School in Japan for our Japanese Cultural Immersion Program.

This exchange improved our Japanese guests' English skills, providing our students with the opportunity to practice Japanese speaking. The highlight came on Monday's farewell ceremony, where Shizuoka students shared a lively dance, teaching our students the Japanese version of the New Zealand haka. Meanwhile, our Year 8 Rock Band performed a fantastic song for our guests. This cultural exchange not only developed skills but also forged numerous new friendships. Our students actively engaged in the annual Mater Chess Tournament, where more than forty participants across different years competed to accumulate points for their respective Houses. This week, Mater Maria hosted the Tut Roadshow, an exceptional archaeological exhibition, offering students a captivating exploration of Ancient Egypt's treasures. Our Year 7 students engaged in three multimedia theatrette displays, creating intricate ancient seal replicas, exploring Forensic Archaeology with replica human skulls and personalising cartouches through stamping. It was a wonderful opportunity for our students to experience a hands-on journey through history at the College.

Year 10 students embarked on a camping trip to Killalea Regional Park, where they collaborated to bring food supplies, tents and all necessary camping gear for a three-day adventure. The program is designed to cultivate friendships, encourage challenges and foster a growth mindset. Additionally, students participated in a bush regeneration activity as part of the program's environmental appreciation component. Mentor classes in Years 7, 8, 9, and 11 united in gathering non-perishable food items to assemble hampers for the Vinnies Christmas Appeal. These generous donations were handed over to Vinnies on Friday. Simultaneously, Year 10 students, inspired by their recent visit to Jesuit Social Services, initiated a wide collection of nonperishable grocery items for their own Jesuit Social Services, Mount Druitt Appeal. The generosity demonstrated by our Mater community for both Christmas appeals has been outstanding. Our Year 12 student, Will Makin, has achieved an outstanding feat by securing the 6th position in the Student category of the Australian Wood. Applications for Year 7 in 2026 are open for prospective students and parents, while waiting lists are in place for Year 7 in 2024 and 2025. 

Entrance Antiphon Revelation 5:12; 1:6

How worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honour. To him belong glory and power for ever and ever.

First Reading

Ezekiel 34:11-12. 15-17

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel You, my flock, I judge between sheep and sheep.

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them.

Gospel Matthew 25:31-46 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

He will take his seat on his throne of glory, and he will separate men one from another.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For $\tilde{\mathbf{I}}$ was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed

me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'


Communion Antiphon Psalm 28:10-11

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

We have now come to the end of the liturgical year, the point that marks the transition from one period to another. Today we see that the kingdom of God is inclusive. Its embrace is as comprehensive as is the embrace of God. Criteria for membership are not based on obedience to the commandments or on conformity to ritual obligation, but on the bonds of love and concern. What we do for others, we do for Christ, because Christ is identified with those in need. We very seldom see the face of the glorified Christ in the faces of the needy; it is more often the face of the disfigured Christ that is turned to us. We see his fear and his shame, his brokenness and sense of loss. As difficult as it may be to look into such eyes, it is precisely the needy with whom Christ is identified. Having entered into the frailty of human nature, identified himself with the needy, and handed himself over to death, in the end Christ will have conquered all. It is a curious kingdom that he has won, a kingdom of the weak rather than the strong. He has turned the standards of the world upside down. He has shown that it does not take strength to ignore or to exploit the needy, but it does take strength to overcome our own selfishness in order to serve them. The kingdom that Christ hands over to God is a kingdom of love and care.
