Soibada Update

It has been a wonderful year of returning to normality – almost! It has been tough trying to maintain our usual level of support for Pittwater's sister parish and village Soibada in Timor Leste (formerly East Timor) during the Covid years. However, our great team of volunteers has managed to keep the momentum going and a surprising number of projects have been completed without us in the country. The highlight was Father Richard's recent visit to the village.

After a frantic fundraising drive at the end of 2021 the interim Soibada Preschool opened early in the new year. Our community funded 10 scholarships and made it possible for pre-schoolers from Soibada Sub Villages (sucos) to attend. Wages for two qualified teachers were also raised. When the team visited in July it became apparent that the staff and Sisters had done an incredible job. The education standard at the preschool is so high that the local primary school children come up for extra lessons at the end of their classes. We managed to send a group to Soibada in July and again in October. Much has changed in the village during our absence. The leaders we had worked with in the past have moved on and been replaced. A committee has been established to help us with our projects and lots of new relationships were formed. The way ahead looks very organized! We now have dedicated project managers on our team for Health and Medical, Education, and Women's Small Business Development. There will be news about developments in these areas in January.

Hospitality and Training education has been going well at the centre that we previously funded. A traditional cooking competition was held in July, sponsored by Avalon Beach RSL Club. The uniforms for the centre have been donated by Dee Why RSL Club. A student from Mater Maria Catholic College was involved in this event. One of our volunteers has taken on the onerous task of our website! So our marketing and media will be taken to the next level soon. In the meantime Facebook is the easiest way to keep up to date.

The blankets and baby clothes made by Northern Beaches volunteers were gratefully received. They are more than items of clothing or warmth, they are a symbol of our love and care for the families in our sister village. The Soibada Knitters and Crocheters meet on Thursdays during term time at Avalon Beach RSL and would welcome more members. There are others out there in our community who supply us with handmade items for Soibada as well. We are always in need of donations of wool. Days for Girls met monthly in Maria Regina Church Hall. Not only do they provide washable sanitary kits for the schoolgirls of Soibada but they are sent all over the world.

In October each year the village celebrates the Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Aitara. Thousands of pilgrims arrive from all over Timor Leste to commemorate the sighting of the Virgin Mary many years ago. The weekend is filled with Processions, Masses and parties. Father Richard represented our Parish and was warmly welcomed by local priest Father John. Even during this time of celebration the extreme poverty and need of the people of Soibada was evident. There is no running water to the homes in the village and parts of it still have no electricity. Malnutrition impacts the health of the children and stunts their growth. The effects of 25 years of occupation and war remain obvious, yet the faith and resilience of the Timorese people is inspiring. Next year we will organise a get together at the Parish Centre to show photos and tell you all about the October visit.

None of the many projects would be at all possible if it wasn't for our generous volunteers and donors. There are countless people quietly working throughout the year in the background to make this happen. If you would like to contribute to the fundraising efforts the code below will take you to our crowdfunding site that explains more about the projects. Donations are tax deductible. REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Liturgically, the Octave of Christmas commemorates: the Solemnity of the Mother of God; the day designated for prayers for global peace; and the beginning of the New Year. Though the shepherds gain insight into the presence of God by seeing this holy family, it is Mary who holds all these things in her heart. She is the one who ponders the significance of these mysterious events. Mary becomes for Christians an inspiration of contemplation and reflection. She inspires us to consider deeply the significance of events, lest we go blandly through life without meaning or direction. She inspires us to fidelity to the practices of our faith, practices which are the disciplines of soul that lead the community to a clearer focus on God's presence in human affairs. The theme of peace appears today on many levels. Its meaning, 'fullness of life', bursts forth in every one of the readings. The ancient prayer or blessing of peace is an appropriate start for the New Year. It resonates well with the angels' wish for people of good will. Peace is also our inheritance in Christ. As adopted children of God, we have been given the freedom to live in a godly manner, calling God our Abba. Right relationships in the covenant activity of God are the pathways of peace. The beginning of a New Year is a good time to reach out to others and to pray for God's blessing of peace for each dimension of human encounter.
